# FISCAL NOTE Revised

House Bill 157 (Delegate Harrison, et al.) Economic Matters

#### **Insurance - Fees - Repeal**

This bill repeals a provision of the Insurance Article which permits the Insurance Commissioner to charge a one-dollar fee for copying documents on file in the Commissioner's office.

## **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** General fund revenues could decrease by as much as \$30,000 annually, as discussed below. Expenditures would not be affected.

Local Effect: None.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

**State Effect:** The Maryland Insurance Administration advises that it collects approximately \$30,000 annually for copying documents. Therefore, if the one-dollar copy fee is repealed, revenues could decrease by about \$30,000 annually. However, the Public Information Act of the State Government Article provides that the custodian of State documents may charge a "reasonable fee" for copying documents. Therefore, the Insurance Commissioner could impose a copy fee in accordance with this Act and recover some of this lost revenue.
