House Bill 337 (Delegate Grosfeld, et al.) Judiciary

## Family Law - Grounds for Absolute Divorce - Constructive Desertion

This bill establishes an additional ground for absolute divorce to be known as "constructive desertion." Two conditions must be met for a decree of absolute divorce to be granted for this cause: (1) conduct by a party inconsistent with maintaining the health, self-respect, and reasonable comfort of the other party within the marriage; and (2) persistent conduct damaging to the safety, health, or self-respect of the complainant.
