## Baltimore City - Circuit Court - Appearance Fees

This bill increases the attorney appearance fees in Baltimore City from \$10 to $\$ 20$ for all cases except less serious criminal cases. This bill is effective July 1, 1996.

## Fiscal Summary

State Effect: General fund revenues would increase by $\$ 18,300$ in FY 1997, rising by about $3 \%$ annually. Expenditures would not be affected.

Local Effect: Revenues of the Library Company of the Baltimore Bar could increase by an estimated \$347,300 in FY 1997.

## Fiscal Analysis

State Revenues: Assuming fees are waived on half of administrative appeals and $20 \%$ of divorce and non-paternity domestic cases, this bill would increase total collections of appearance fees by an estimated $\$ 365,580$ in fiscal 1997 . Five percent of revenues collected by the circuit court clerks are paid to the state general fund. This amounts to $\$ 18,279$ in fiscal 1997. Filings are assumed to increase 3\% annually.

Local Revenues: As stated above, this bill is expected to increase total collections of appearance fees by an estimated $\$ 365,580$ in fiscal 1997. Appearance fees in Baltimore City are paid to the Library Company of the Baltimore Bar to be used for the bar library. This amounts to $\$ 347,301$, after deducting the $5 \%$ which goes to the state general fund, in fiscal 1997. Filings are assumed to increase $3 \%$ annually.
