House Bill 1019 (Delegate Klima, et al.) Commerce and Government Matters

Blind, Deaf, or Mobility Impaired Pedestrians - Right-of-Way - Penalties

This bill increases the penalties for failure to yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian who is blind, hearing impaired with a guide dog, or mobility impaired by assessing points against the driver.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The Motor Vehicle Administration reports that there was only one violation of this law in 1994 and only three in 1993. Since the bill would apply in a limited number of cases, State finances would not be affected.
