(a) (3) However, an adjudication of a child as delinquent by reason of his violation of the State vehicle laws, INCLUDING A VIOLATION INVOLVING AN UNLAWFUL TAKING OR UNAUTHORIZED USE OF A MOTOR VEHICLE UNDER ARTICLE 27, § 342A OR § 349, OR § 14-102 OF THE TRANSPORTATION ARTICLE shall be reported by the clerk of the court to the Motor Vehicle Administration, which shall assess points against the child under Title 16, Subtitle 4 of the Transportation Article, in the same manner and to the same effect as if the child had been convicted of the offense.".
