- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16
- 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- (a) (1) [If] UNLESS THE EMPLOYER OR ITS INSURER FILES ISSUES WITH 20
- 21 THE COMMISSION STATING THE REASON FOR THE DENIAL OF PAYMENT, IF the
- 22 Commission finds that the employer or [its] insurer has failed, without good cause, to
- 23 pay for treatment or services required by § 9-660 of this Part IX of this subtitle within 45
- 24 days after the [Commission, by order, finally approves] RECEIPT OF AN ITEMIZED
- 25 STATEMENT FROM THE PROVIDER REQUESTING PAYMENT OF the fee or charge for
- 26 the treatment or services RENDERED, the Commission may impose a fine on the
- 27 employer or insurer, not exceeding 20% of the amount of the approved fee or charge.
- (2) The employer or insurer shall pay the fine to the Commission to be
- 29 deposited in the General Fund of the State.
