- 21 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 22 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

	(a) (1) A regulated lobbyist shall file with the Ethics Commission, under oath and for each registration, a separate report concerning the regulated lobbyist's lobbying activities:
9 10	(i) by May 31 of each year, to cover the period from November 1 of the previous year through April 30 of the current year; and
11 12	$\hbox{(ii) by November 30 of each year, to cover the period from May 1} \\ \hbox{through October 31 of that year.}$
13 14	(2) If the regulated lobbyist is not an individual, an authorized officer or agent of the regulated lobbyist shall sign the report.
15 16	(3) If a prorated amount is reported as compensation, it shall be labeled as prorated.
