- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1997. It shall remain effective for a period of 7 months and, at the end of December 31, 1997, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
