# A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

#### 2 Health - Hotels - Cleaning Commonly Used Items

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring hotels, motels, and other similar lodgings, at certain times,
- 4 to clean certain items in a room; requiring the Department of Health and Mental
- 5 Hygiene to make certain inspections to enforce this Act; providing for certain
- 6 penalties for violation of this Act; requiring certain persons to pay the cost of
- 7 certain inspections; authorizing the Department to adopt regulations to enforce this
- 8 Act; defining certain terms; and generally relating to health and cleanliness in
- 9 hotels.

- 12 Section 24-901 through 24-905 to be under the new subtitle "Subtitle 9. Hotels -
- 13 Sanitation"
- 14 Annotated Code of Maryland

#### 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

## 18 **Article - Health - General**

19 SUBTITLE 9. HOTELS - SANITATION.

- 21 (A) IN THIS SUBTITLE THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
- 22 INDICATED.
- 23 (B) "COMMONLY USED ITEMS IN A HOTEL ROOM" INCLUDE:
- 24 (1) BEDDING, AS DEFINED IN § 24-401 OF THIS TITLE;
- 25 (2) BLANKETS;
- 26 (3) CARPETING;
- 27 (4) REUSABLE DRINKING RECEPTACLES;

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1	(5) SHEETS;
2	(6) TELEPHONES; AND
3	(7) TOWELS.
	(C) (1) "HOTEL" MEANS AN ESTABLISHMENT THAT OFFERS SLEEPING ACCOMMODATIONS FOR RENT AND IS PRIMARILY USED BY TRANSIENTS WHO ARE LODGED WITH OR WITHOUT MEALS.
7 8	(2) "HOTEL" INCLUDES A BED AND BREAKFAST ESTABLISHMENT, BOARDING HOUSE, INN, MOTEL, OR ORDINARY.
	(D) (1) "INFECTIOUS AGENT" MEANS AN ORGANISM THAT IS CAPABLE OF PRODUCING CONTAMINATION, INFECTION, OR INFECTIOUS OR COMMUNICABLE DISEASE.
12 13	(2) "INFECTIOUS AGENT" INCLUDES A VIRUS, RICKETTSIA, BACTERIA, FUNGUS, PROTOZOA, OR HELMINTH.

15 16	THE DEPARTMENT MAY ADOPT REGULATIONS TO CARRY OUT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SUBTITLE.
17	24-903.
20 21	(A) TO SAFEGUARD THE HEALTH, SAFETY, AND GENERAL WELFARE OF THE PUBLIC, THE DEPARTMENT, AT LEAST ANNUALLY, SHALL INSPECT ALL HOTELS TO ENSURE THAT ROOMS ARE BEING CLEANED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SUBTITLE. THE INSPECTION SHALL INCLUDE THE RANDOM SAMPLING OF COMMONLY USED ITEMS IN A HOTEL ROOM AND MAY BE PERFORMED AT ANY REASONABLE TIME.
23 24	(B) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REINSPECT EACH HOTEL FOUND TO BE IN VIOLATION OF THIS SUBTITLE.
	(C) DURING AN INSPECTION MADE UNDER THIS SECTION, THE DEPARTMENT MAY OPEN, EXAMINE, OR SEIZE FOR EVIDENCE ANY OBJECT THAT THE DEPARTMENT BELIEVES VIOLATES THIS SUBTITLE.

- (D) THE OWNER OF A HOTEL SHALL REIMBURSE THE DEPARTMENT FOR THE 28
- 29 COST OF AN INSPECTION OF THE OWNER'S HOTEL.
- 30 (E) A PERSON MAY NOT INTERFERE WITH ANY INSPECTION UNDER THIS 31 SUBTITLE.
- 32 24-904.
- (A) AFTER EACH RENTAL OF A HOTEL ROOM, A HOTEL SHALL CLEAN ALL
- 34 COMMONLY USED ITEMS IN THE HOTEL ROOM BY REMOVING INFECTIOUS AGENTS
- 35 FROM SURFACES ON WHICH AND IN WHICH INFECTIOUS AGENTS MAY FIND
- 36 FAVORABLE CONDITIONS FOR SURVIVING OR MULTIPLYING BY:
- (1) SCRUBBING AND WASHING WITH HOT WATER AND SOAP OR OTHER 37
- 38 SUITABLE DETERGENT; OR

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- 2 (B) A HOTEL MAY CLEAN ALL COMMONLY USED ITEMS IN A HOTEL ROOM
- 3 MORE FREQUENTLY THAN REQUIRED UNDER SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION.
- 4 24-905.
- 5 (A) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES ANY PROVISION OF THIS SUBTITLE OR ANY
- 6 REGULATION ADOPTED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE IS SUBJECT TO A CIVIL PENALTY NOT
- 7 EXCEEDING:
- 8 (1) \$50 FOR A FIRST VIOLATION; AND
- 9 (2) \$250 FOR EACH SUBSEQUENT VIOLATION.
- 10 (B) A PERSON WHO, AFTER A REINSPECTION, CONTINUES TO BE IN
- 11 VIOLATION IS SUBJECT TO A CIVIL PENALTY OF NOT LESS THAN \$100 AND NOT
- 12 EXCEEDING \$250 FOR EACH CONTINUING VIOLATION.
- 13 (C) EACH DAY DURING WHICH A PERSON VIOLATES ANY PROVISION OF THIS
- 14 SUBTITLE OR THE REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER THIS SUBTITLE, AFTER
- 15 KNOWLEDGE OR OFFICIAL NOTICE OF THE VIOLATION, SHALL BE DEEMED A
- 16 SEPARATE VIOLATION.
- 17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 18 October 1, 1997.
