CHAPTER ____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Drivers' Licenses - Testing for Motorcycle Permits and Licenses - Waiver

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Motor Vehicle Administration to waive certain
4 learner's permit and licensing examination requirements for any individual who
5 successfully completes a certain motorcycle safety course; providing that the
6 successful completion of a certain motorcycle safety course shall be the equivalent
7 of passing certain tests required by the Administration; and generally relating to
8 motorcycle licensing and permit requirements.

19 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **Article - Transportation**

3 (f) (1) The Administration may issue a driver's license, without first issuing a
4 learner's instructional permit and without a waiting period, to any individual who:

5 (I) [has] HAS been licensed regularly to drive in this State, in another
6 state or country, or by the armed forces of the United States, if the Administration is
7 satisfied that the applicant's experience in driving vehicles of the type that would be
8 authorized by the license class applied for is sufficient to justify issuance of the license
9 without further training; OR

10 (II) HAS SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED THE ADMINISTRATION
11 APPROVED BASIC MOTORCYCLE SAFETY COURSE.

12 (2) The Administration may examine the applicant's driving as provided in §
13 16-110 of this title.

14 16-110.

15 (g) Except as provided in subsection (h) of this section, the Administration may
16 waive any driver's license examination provided for under this title if the applicant:

17 (1) Holds a valid driver's license issued under this subtitle; [or]

18 (2) IS APPLYING FOR A CLASS M LICENSE AND HAS SUCCESSFULLY
19 COMPLETED THE ADMINISTRATION APPROVED BASIC MOTORCYCLE SAFETY
20 COURSE; OR

21 [(2)] (3) Holds a valid license from:

22 (i) Another State;

23 (ii) A territory or possession of the United States, the District of
24 Columbia, or the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico; or

25 (iii) A province or territory of Canada.

26 (h) The Administration may not waive a vision examination required under this
27 section.

29 (a) The Department and the Administration shall administer the Motorcycle
30 Safety Program.

31 (b) The Administration, a State or community college, State university, an agency
32 of a political subdivision or any other person approved and designated by the
33 Administration may organize and manage a motorcycle safety training center and may
34 offer motorcycle safety courses at those centers that it operates.

35 (c) The Administration may operate a mobile training center to provide courses
36 at various locations in the State.

1 (d) (1) Subject to the regulations adopted under this subtitle, any resident of
2 this State who possesses a valid Class E or Class M driver's license, a Class E or Class M
3 learner's instructional permit, or is eligible for a Class M learner's instructional permit,
4 may enroll in a course.

5 (2) A nonresident may apply for and be accepted for enrollment in courses
6 authorized under this subtitle; however, the reimbursement provided under § 16-605(b)
7 may not be made for a nonresident trainee.

8 (3) An eligible individual may take a course more than one time, but the
9 reimbursement provided in § 16-605(b) of this subtitle may only be paid one time for any
10 individual.

11 (4) For a course that is to be reimbursed under this subtitle, a training
12 center may charge a trainee a reasonable course registration fee.

13 (5) For a course offered at a training center operated by the Administration,
14 the Administration may collect a reasonable course registration fee established by the
15 Administration.

16 (e) The courses may be offered throughout the calendar year.

17 (F) THE SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF THE ADMINISTRATION APPROVED
18 BASIC MOTORCYCLE SAFETY COURSE SHALL BE CONSIDERED THE EQUIVALENT OF
19 PASSING THE SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TEST REQUIRED UNDER §§ 16-105 AND 16-110
20 OF THIS TITLE FOR OBTAINING A CLASS M DRIVER'S LICENSE.

21 [(f)] (G) (1) The Department shall provide a program coordinator to organize
22 and administer all tasks related to the achievement of the purpose of the Motorcycle
23 Safety Program as provided under this subtitle.

24 (2) The program coordinator shall be experienced in the motorcycle safety
25 field and shall possess those qualifications as may be specified by the Secretary.

26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
27 October 1, 1997.
