- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 16 (a) Subject to the provisions of this section, the Board may [waive any
- 17 examination requirement of this subtitle for] ISSUE A LICENSE BY RECIPROCITY TO
- 18 PRACTICE ENGINEERING IN THIS STATE TO an individual who is CURRENTLY licensed
- 19 to practice engineering in another state or territory of the United States or in a foreign
- 20 country.
- 21 (b) The Board may [grant a waiver] ISSUE A LICENSE under this section only if
- 22 the applicant:
- 23 (1) is of good character and reputation;
- 24 (2) pays to the Board a license fee of \$100 in lieu of any fee required under
- 25 § 14-312 of this subtitle; and
- 26 (3) provides adequate evidence that:

4 (ii) at the time of application for [waiver of the examination 5 requirements] LICENSURE BY RECIPROCITY under this section, the applicant meets the 6 [education and experience] requirements currently required by the laws of this State.	he
7 (c) An engineer who is [granted a waiver of the examination requirements and 8 becomes] licensed by the Board BY RECIPROCITY may not be required to maintain 9 licensure in any other state, territory, or foreign country as a condition of maintaining the 10 license granted by the Board.	

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 12 October 1, 1997.
