- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 15 **Article Transportation**
- 16 16-105.
- 17 (a) (1) Any individual who desires to obtain an original driver's license under
- 18 this subtitle or to be licensed in a class for which he is not already licensed under this
- 19 subtitle shall apply to the Administration for the desired driver's license.
- 20 (2) Except as provided in subsection (f) of this section, before issuing a
- 21 driver's license, the Administration shall issue to each applicant a learner's instructional
- 22 permit. The learner's instructional permit shall identify clearly the class of license for
- 23 which the applicant has applied.
- 24 (b) The holder of a learner's instructional permit may drive the same vehicle and
- 25 combinations of vehicles as may a holder of the class of driver's license for which he has
- 26 applied, but only while he is accompanied by and under the immediate supervision of an
- 27 individual who:
- 28 (1) Is at least 21 years old;

	(2) [Has been]IS licensed [for at least 3 years in this State or in another state] to drive vehicles of the class then being driven by the holder of the learner's instructional permit; and
4 5	(3) Unless the vehicle is a motorcycle, is seated beside the holder of the learner's instructional permit.
	(c) The holder of a learner's instructional permit for a motorcycle may drive the motorcycle with another individual on it only if the other individual is one described in subsection (b)(1) and (2) of this section.
9 10	(d) (1) The holder of a learner's instructional permit may take the driver's license examination no sooner than 14 days after the permit is issued.
11 12	(2) The 14 days' requirement may be waived if a subsequent learner's instructional permit is issued or applied for.
13	(e) A learner's instructional permit expires 180 days after date of issuance.
16 17 18	(f) (1) The Administration may issue a driver's license, without first issuing a learner's instructional permit and without a waiting period, to any individual who has been licensed regularly to drive in this State, in another state or country, or by the armed forces of the United States, if the Administration is satisfied that the applicant's experience in driving vehicles of the type that would be authorized by the license class applied for is sufficient to justify issuance of the license without further training.
20 21	(2) The Administration may examine the applicant's driving as provided in \S 16-110 of this title.
	(g) An individual holding a learner's instructional permit issued under this section may not drive or attempt to drive a motor vehicle on any highway in this State in violation of any of the provisions of this section.

28 29	(a) Except when driving under a commercial driver's instructional permit and accompanied by the holder of a driver's license valid for the class of vehicle being driven, an individual may not drive a commercial motor vehicle unless the individual has been issued and is in immediate possession of a driver's license valid for the class of vehicle being driven.
33 34	(b) (1) An individual may not be issued a commercial driver's license until the individual has passed the knowledge and skill tests for driving a commercial motor vehicle which complies with the minimum federal standards established by the federal Commercial Motor Vehicle Safety Act of 1986 (Title XII of Public Law 99-570), and has satisfied all other requirements of that act as well as any other requirements of this title.
36 37	(2) The tests shall be prescribed and conducted at the direction of the Administration.
	(3) The Administration shall adopt regulations to waive the skill test required under paragraph (1) of this subsection in a manner consistent with 49 CFR § 383.77.

1	(c) A commercial driver's license may be issued only to:
2 3	(1) An individual who drives or will drive a commercial motor vehicle and who is a resident of this State; and
4	(2) Those nonresidents who may qualify under § 16-817 of this subtitle.
5	(d) A commercial driver's license may not be issued to an individual:
6 7	(1) While the individual is disqualified from driving a commercial motor vehicle;
8	(2) While the individual's driver's license is suspended, revoked, or canceled in this State or any other state; or
	(3) While the individual holds a commercial driver's license or driver's license issued by any other jurisdiction, unless the individual surrenders that license for return to the issuing jurisdiction for cancellation.
	(e) (1) A commercial driver's instructional permit may be issued for the class of commercial driver's license applied for only to an individual who has passed the appropriate knowledge and vision screening tests.
18	(2) The holder of a commercial driver's instructional permit may drive a commercial motor vehicle on a highway only when the individual is accompanied by and under the immediate supervision of the holder of a driver's license valid for the type of vehicle driven, if the accompanying driver[:
20	(i) Is at least 21 years old; and
21 22	(ii) Has been licensed for at least 3 years in this State or in another state to drive vehicles of the class then being driven]IS AT LEAST 21 YEARS OLD.
23 24	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1997.
