CHAPTER ____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Correctional Institutions - Citizens' Advisory Committees - Cumberland

3 FOR the purpose of creating a citizens' advisory committee for State correctional
4 facilities located in Cumberland; and generally relating to a citizens' advisory
5 committee for State correctional facilities located in Cumberland.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 Article 41 - Governor - Executive and Administrative Departments

19 4-1101.

20 (a) In this subheading the following words have the meanings indicated.

1 (b) "Commissioner" means the Commissioner of the Division of Correction of the
2 Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services.

3 (c) "Committee" means the citizens' advisory committees established under this
4 subheading.

5 (d) "Department" means the Department of Public Safety and Correctional
6 Services.

7 4-1102.

8 (a) There is a citizens' advisory committee for the institutions of the Department
9 located or planned for location in:

10 (1) Baltimore;

11 (2) Hagerstown;

12 (3) Jessup; [and]

13 (4) Somerset County; AND

14 (5) CUMBERLAND.

15 (b) Except as provided in subsection (e) of this section, each committee consists
16 of 7 members appointed by the Governor as required under subsections (c) and (d) of this
17 section.

18 (c) (1) The Senator and each Delegate from the legislative district in which the
19 institutions are located shall each submit a name to the Governor.

20 (2) Each member nominated by a Senator or Delegate shall be a resident of
21 the legislative district in which the institutions are located.

22 (3) The Governor shall appoint each person nominated by a Senator or
23 Delegate for a vacancy on a committee within 60 days after receipt of the nominee's
24 name.

25 (d) (1) To the extent possible, the additional 3 members shall be appointed to
26 provide for legal, law-enforcement, and business representatives on each committee.

27 (2) Each of these 3 members shall be a resident of the county in which the
28 institutions are located.

29 (e) (1) In Somerset County, the citizens' advisory committee consists of 8
30 members appointed as required under this subsection.

31 (2) (i) The Senator and each Delegate from Legislative District 38 shall
32 each submit a name to the Governor.

33 (ii) Each member nominated by a Senator or Delegate shall be a
34 resident of Somerset County.

1 (iii) The Governor shall appoint each person nominated by a Senator
2 or Delegate for a vacancy on a committee within 60 days after the receipt of the
3 nominee's name.

4 (3) (i) The Governor shall appoint, to the extent possible, 3 additional
5 members to provide for legal, law enforcement, and business representatives on the
6 committee.

7 (ii) Each of these 3 members shall be a resident of Somerset County.

8 (4) One member shall be a Somerset County Commissioner who is
9 appointed by the Board of County Commissioners.

10 (f) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection and except for the
11 initial appointments to the committee, the term of a member is 3 years.

12 (2) The term of the Somerset County Commissioner, appointed under
13 subsection (e) of this section, is equal to the Commissioner's elected term.

14 (3) The terms of members are staggered.

15 (4) At the end of a term, a member continues to serve until a successor is
16 appointed and qualifies.

17 (5) A member who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for the
18 rest of the term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.

19 (g) (1) From among its members, each committee shall elect a chairman.

20 (2) The manner of election shall be as each committee determines.

21 (h) A majority of the members then serving on a committee is a quorum.

22 (i) (1) Each committee shall meet at least once each 3 months.

23 (2) The meetings of each committee shall be held:

24 (i) In an institution in a space designated by the warden of the
25 institution; or

26 (ii) If an institution is being planned, in another location accessible to
27 the members of the committee.

28 (j) A member of a committee may not receive compensation.

30 (a) A committee may:

31 (1) Report to the Commissioner and the Governor about the concerns of
32 the citizens residing in the vicinity of each institution;

33 (2) Be available to interpret each institution's programs and problems to the
34 citizens residing in the vicinity of each institution; and

35 (3) Perform other services and responsibilities as may be deemed necessary.

1 (b) The Department shall provide staff to the committee in accordance with the
2 State budget.

3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
4 October 1, 1997.
