A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Health Insurance - Small Employer Groups - Health Benefit Plans

3 FOR the purpose of making the Maryland Health Insurance Reform Act applicable to

4 health benefit plans issued through certain employee leasing organizations.

5 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 13 Article Insurance
- 14 15-1201.
- 15 (f) (1) "Health benefit plan" means:
- 16 (i) a policy or certificate for hospital or medical benefits;
- 17 (ii) a nonprofit health service plan; or
- 18 (iii) a health maintenance organization subscriber or group master
- 19 contract.

20 (2) "Health benefit plan" includes a policy or certificate for hospital or
21 medical benefits THAT COVERS RESIDENTS OF THIS STATE WHO ARE ELIGIBLE
22 EMPLOYEES AND that is issued through:

(I) a multiple employer trust or association located in this State oranother state [and that covers residents of this State who are eligible employees]; OR

25 (II) A PROFESSIONAL EMPLOYER ORGANIZATION, COEMPLOYER,
26 OR OTHER ORGANIZATION LOCATED IN THIS STATE OR ANOTHER STATE THAT
27 ENGAGES IN EMPLOYEE LEASING.

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(3) "Health benefit plan" does not include:

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1	(i) accident-only insurance;
2	(ii) fixed indemnity insurance;
3	(iii) credit health insurance;
4	(iv) Medicare supplement policies;
5 (v) Civilian Health and Medical Program of the Uniformed Services 6 (CHAMPUS) supplement policies;	
7	(vi) long-term care insurance;
8	(vii) disability income insurance;
9	(viii) coverage issued as a supplement to liability insurance;
10	(ix) workers' compensation or similar insurance;
11	(x) disease-specific insurance;
12	(xi) automobile medical payment insurance;
13	(xii) dental insurance; or
14	(xiii) vision insurance.
15 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect	

16 October 1, 1997.
