A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Health Occupations - Dental Hygienists - Education

3	FOR the purpose of altering the definition of "practice dental hygiene" to include certain
4	practices, techniques, or procedures that are included in certain dental hygiene
5	programs; requiring an applicant for a license to practice dental hygiene or
6	temporary license to practice dental hygiene to be a graduate of a dental hygiene
7	program that is accredited by a certain entity; requiring an applicant for a license to
8	practice dental hygiene, who fails a certain examination, to complete a certain
9	number of hours of additional education in a dental hygiene program that is
10	accredited by a certain entity; altering a provision of law to add an additional
11	ground for which, if violated, the State Board of Dental Examiners may deny,
12	suspend, or revoke certain licenses under certain circumstances; authorizing a
13	certain committee of the Board to maintain a certain action in its own name under
14	certain circumstances; and generally relating to altering certain provisions of law

1	(1) Perform a preliminary dental examination;
2	(2) Perform a complete prophylaxis, including the removal of any deposit, accretion, or stain from the surface of a tooth or a restoration;

5 6	(4) Chart cavities, restorations, missing teeth, periodontal conditions, and other features observed during preliminary examination, prophylaxis, or polishing;
7	(5) Apply a medicinal agent to a tooth for a prophylactic purpose;

	(a) (1) Except as otherwise provided in this title, an individual shall be licensed by the Board to practice dentistry before the individual may practice dentistry on a human being in this State.
	(2) Except as otherwise provided in this title, an individual shall be licensed by the Board to practice dental hygiene before the individual may practice dental hygiene on a human being in this State.

23 24	(1) A student of dentistry while engaged in an educational program at an approved school of dentistry;
25	(2) A dentist while performing official duties in a federal dental service;

	(1) Requires at least 2 years of [study; and] EDUCATION THAT CONSISTS OF CREDITS THAT CAN BE TRANSFERRED INTO A 4-YEAR ACCREDITED COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY;

25 26	(f) (1) An applicant who fails an examination twice shall complete 40 hours of additional [training] EDUCATION in an accredited school of dentistry or A dental hygiene PROGRAM ACCREDITED BY THE AMERICAN DENTAL ASSOCIATION COMMISSION ON DENTAL ACCREDITATION, as appropriate, before the applicant may retake the examination.						
30 31	(2) An applicant who fails an examination 3 times shall retake and successfully complete the senior year of training at an accredited school of dentistry or A dental hygiene PROGRAM ACCREDITED BY THE AMERICAN DENTAL ASSOCIATION COMMISSION ON DENTAL ACCREDITATION, as appropriate, before the applicant may retake the examination.
