3 FOR the purpose of altering the time table for license renewal and expiration; requiring

- 4 the Secretary of the Department of State Police to develop a regulation regarding
- 5 the expiration months of certain licenses altering the terms and renewal of certain
- 6 private detective agency licenses; requiring the Secretary of the Department of
- 7 State Police to stagger the terms of certain private detective agency licenses by
- 8 regulation; adjusting certain license renewal fees to correspond with the <del>augmented</del>
- 9 <u>altered</u> license terms; adjusting the time period for which an applicant for license
- 10 renewal must submit certain information to the Secretary of the Department of
- 11 State Police; expanding the definition of "provide private detective services" to
- 12 include nonuniformed personal protection; and generally relating to the licensing
- 13 and regulation of private detectives.

2 (a) As a condition for license renewal, a licensee shall submit to the Secretary 3 with the renewal application:

4 (1) a certification or, as authorized by the Secretary, other documentation 5 that the licensed private detective agency has paid, for the past [calendar year] 2 YEARS, 6 all withholding and Social Security taxes;

7 (2) a certification or, as authorized by the Secretary, other documentation
8 that the licensed private detective agency has paid, for the past [calendar year] 2 YEARS,
9 all other obligations payable for the employees of the licensed private detective agency to
10 the State or the federal government;

(3) a certificate from an insurance carrier or, as authorized by the Secretary,
other documentation showing that the licensed private detective agency has in effect
workers' compensation insurance for its covered employees, as defined in § 9-101 of the
Labor and Employment Article; and

(4) a receipt from the Comptroller's Office or, as authorized by the
Secretary, other documentation showing that the State income tax of the licensed private
detective agency has been paid for the past [calendar year ] 2 YEARS.

(b) If the Secretary does not receive the documents required under subsection (a)
of this section on or before [April 15] THE 15TH DAY OF THE EXPIRATION MONTH AT
LEAST 15 DAYS BEFORE THE LICENSE EXPIRATION DATE, the Secretary shall charge
the licensee a late fee of \$10 per day until the documents are received.

(c) The Secretary may inspect any of the business records of a licensee that relateto any matter that is subject to certification or documentation under this section.
