3 FOR the purpose of altering the schedule for security guard license renewal and

4 expiration; requiring the Secretary of the Department of State Police to adopt

- 5 regulations regarding the expiration months of certain licenses altering the terms
- 6 and renewal of certain security guard agency licenses; requiring the Secretary of the
- 7 Department of State Police to stagger the terms of certain security guard agency

8 <u>licenses by regulation;</u> adjusting certain license renewal fees to correspond with the

- 9 augmented <u>altered</u> license terms; adjusting the time period for which an applicant
- 10 for license renewal must submit certain information to the Secretary of the
- 11 Department of State Police; and generally relating to the licensing and regulation of
- 12 security guard agencies.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

22 (A) BY REGULATION, THE SECRETARY SHALL STAGGER THE TERMS OF THE

23 LICENSES.

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3	(a) (B) Unless a license is renewed for a [1-year] 2-YEAR term as provided in this section, the license expires on the [first April 30 after the effective date of the license] FIFTEENTH DAY OF THE EXPIRATION MONTH DESIGNATED BY REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE SECRETARY DATE THE SECRETARY SETS.
5 6	(b) (C) At least 1 month before a license expires, the Secretary shall mail to the licensee, at the last known address of the licensee:
7	(1) a renewal application form; and
8	(2) a notice that states:
9	(i) the date on which the current license expires;
12 13	(ii) that the Secretary must receive the renewal application and the annual statements required under § 19-309 of this subtitle, on or before [April 15] THE FIFTEENTH DAY OF THE EXPIRATION MONTH AT LEAST 15 DAYS BEFORE THE LICENSE EXPIRATION DATE, for the renewal to be issued and mailed before the license expires;

2 (a) As a condition for license renewal, a licensee shall submit to the Secretary 3 with the renewal application:

4 (1) a certification or, as authorized by the Secretary, other documentation 5 that the licensed security guard agency has paid, for the past [calendar year] 2 YEARS, 6 all withholding and Social Security taxes;

7 (2) a certification or, as authorized by the Secretary, other documentation
8 that the licensed security guard agency has paid, for the past [calendar year] 2 YEARS,
9 all other obligations payable for the employees of the licensed security guard agency to
10 the State or the federal government;

(3) a certificate from an insurance carrier or, as authorized by the Secretary,
other documentation showing that the licensed security guard agency has in effect
workers' compensation insurance for its covered employees, as defined in § 9-101 of the
Labor and Employment Article; and

(4) a receipt from the Comptroller's Office or, as authorized by the
Secretary, other documentation showing that the State income tax of the licensed security
guard agency has been paid for the past [calendar year] 2 YEARS.

(b) If the Secretary does not receive the documents required under subsection (a)
of this section on or before [April 15] THE FIFTEENTH DAY OF THE EXPIRATION
MONTH AT LEAST 15 DAYS BEFORE THE LICENSE EXPIRATION DATE, the Secretary
shall charge the licensee a late fee of \$10 per day until the documents are received.

(c) The Secretary may inspect any of the business records of a licensee that relateto any matter that is subject to certification or documentation under this section.

24 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 25 October 1, 1997.

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
