No part of the fund may consist of real 21 property, in-kind contributions, or funds expended prior to the effective date of this Act. 22 In case of any dispute as to what money or assets may qualify as matching funds, the 23 Board of Public Works shall determine the matter, and the Board's decision is final. 24 Grantees have until June 1, 1999 to present evidence satisfactory to the Board of Public 25 Works that the matching fund will be provided. If satisfactory evidence is presented, the 26 Board shall certify this fact to the State Treasurer and the proceeds of the loan shall be 27 expended for the purposes provided in this Act. If this evidence is not presented by June 28 1, 1999, the proceeds of the loan shall be applied to the purposes authorized in Section 29 8-129 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.
- (b) It is further provided that in the cases in which an equal and matching fund is specified in Section 1(3), Items ZA00 and ZB02 above, grantees shall provide a matching fund equal to the lesser of (i) the authorized amount of the State grant or (ii) the amount of the matching fund certified by the Board of Public Works. If satisfactory evidence is presented, the Board shall certify this fact and the amount of the matching fund to the State Treasurer and the proceeds of the loan equal to the amount of the matching fund shall be expended for the purposes provided in this Act. If this evidence is not presented by June 1, 1999, the proceeds of the loan shall be applied to the purposes authorized in Section 8-129 of the State Finance and Procurement Article. The proceeds of any amount of the loan in excess of the matching fund certified by the Board of Public Works shall also be applied to the purposes authorized in Section 8-129 of the State Finance and Procurement Article.
- 42 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland 43 read as follows:

- 2 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 3 MARYLAND, That:
- 4 (5) Prior to the payment of any funds under the provisions of this Act for the

- 34 (A) Public School Construction. Provide funds to construct public

- 37 Article[. Notwithstanding the Board of Public Works' Rules,
- 38 Regulations, and Procedures for the Administration of the School

- 4 planning of a State-owned project provided in this Act, if a program required by Section
- 5 3-602(d) of the State Finance and Procurement Article has not been submitted, then the
- 6 State agency or institution responsible for the project shall submit a program to the
- 7 Department of Budget and Management for approval before funds may be expended
- 8 from the appropriation. For any appropriation for construction of a State-owned project
- 9 provided in this Act, if preliminary plans and outline specifications required by Section

- 30 act, for which an approving legal opinion has been received by the Board, for any
- 31 expenditure authorized by the Act, provided that the next sale of general obligation bonds
- 32 shall include the issuance of bonds under the authority of that Act in an amount at least
- 33 equivalent to the amount of the funds so advanced.
- 34 SECTION 12. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 35 June 1, 1997.
