4 incubator, 75 percent if within three years, 60 percent if within  
5 four years, and 25 percent if within five years. Provided, however,  
6 that for each year that an incubator graduate adds at least ten  
7 full-time Maryland resident employees, it shall offset for one year  
8 of subsidy repayment or increase in equity held by the University.  
9 The State of Maryland is vitally interested in attracting and  
10 retaining new businesses through a number of innovative programs  
11 such as incubator subsidies. The intent is not to penalize, but to  
12 provide incentive to companies to remain in Maryland.].  
13 PROVIDED THAT ALL ENTREPRENEURS OCCUPYING  
14 INCUBATOR SPACE SHALL AGREE IN WRITING TO REIMBURSE  
15 THE INCUBATOR SPONSOR 1.5 TIMES THE COSTS ASSOCIATED  
16 WITH SPACE USE AND RENTAL OR TO INCREASE THE  
17 INCUBATOR SPONSOR'S EQUITY HOLDING IN THE COMPANY  
18 OR THE ROYALTY OBLIGATION BY 50 PERCENT IF AT ANY TIME  
19 WITHIN 5 YEARS OF GRADUATION THE COMPANY  
20 VOLUNTARILY RELOCATES MORE THAN 40 PERCENT OF THE  
21 COMPANY'S TOTAL EMPLOYMENT OUTSIDE THE STATE OF  
22 MARYLAND. FULL REIMBURSEMENT SHALL APPLY TO  
23 COMPANIES THAT EXCEED THE OUT-OF-STATE LIMIT WITHIN  
24 TWO YEARS OF GRADUATION FROM THE INCUBATOR, 75  
25 PERCENT IF WITHIN THE THIRD YEAR, 60 PERCENT IF WITHIN  
26 THE FOURTH YEAR, AND 25 PERCENT IF WITHIN THE FIFTH  
27 YEAR. PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT FOR EVERY TEN  
28 FULL-TIME RESIDENT EMPLOYEES ADDED AND MAINTAINED  
29 IN MARYLAND, THE SUBSIDY REPAYMENT OR INCREASE IN  
30 EQUITY HELD BY THE INCUBATOR SPONSOR OR INCREASE IN  
31 ROYALTY OBLIGATION SHALL BE REDUCED BY 20 PERCENT.  
32 THE STATE OF MARYLAND IS VITALLY INTERESTED IN  
33 ATTRACTING AND RETAINING NEW BUSINESSES THROUGH A  
34 NUMBER OF INNOVATIVE PROGRAMS SUCH AS INCUBATOR  
35 SUBSIDIES. THE INTENT IS NOT TO PENALIZE BUT TO PROVIDE  
36 INCENTIVES TO COMPANIES TO REMAIN IN MARYLAND.  
37 Further provided that preference shall be given to clients  
38 graduating from State university affiliated incubators in the leasing  
39 of the approximately 54,000 net square feet of this facility intended  
40 for use by post-incubator companies. These clients shall be  
41 screened and identified by the Regional Incubator Board  
42 (Baltimore County)..... 5,000,000

43 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the General Assembly  
44 declares that it is the public policy of this State to manage State general obligation bond  
45 debt in a manner that will maintain Maryland's AAA bond rating. The General Assembly  
46 further declares that legislative oversight, control, and review of all forms of State

1 obligations is essential to maintenance of the State's existing bond rating and protection  
2 of the fiscal integrity of the State.

3 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, before work may  
4 commence pursuant to any supplement to any appropriation contained herein,  
5 satisfactory assurance must be given to the Board of Public Works that the project can be  
6 completed with the aggregate of the funds herein and heretofore appropriated for the  
7 stated purpose.

8 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, with the approval of the  
9 Department of Budget and Management, any appropriation for construction provided in  
10 this Act may be used to purchase capital equipment if the amount of the appropriation  
11 exceeds the amount required for construction expenses, including allowances for  
12 contingencies.

13 SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as otherwise  
14 provided in this Act, before a State agency or institution named in this Act as responsible  
15 for an individual item may begin work with funds appropriated by this Act, the agency or  
16 institution shall provide satisfactory evidence to the Board of Public Works that the work  
17 described in the individual item can be completed with the funds specified for that item.

18 SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, with the approval of the  
19 Department of Budget and Management, any appropriation under the provisions of this  
20 Act that is in excess of the amount needed for a project may be credited to the  
21 Construction Contingency Fund under Section 3-609 of the State Finance and  
22 Procurement Article.

23 SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, if federal funds are  
24 available to help accomplish any project identified in this Act, the State agency or  
25 institution responsible for the project shall make efforts through proper administrative  
26 procedures to obtain these federal funds. Before spending any funds appropriated by this  
27 Act, the agency or institution shall certify its efforts to the Board of Public Works and  
28 state the reason for any failure to obtain federal funds. If federal funds are obtained, they  
29 shall be used to defray the costs of the project described in this Act, and not to expand its  
30 scope.

31 SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, for any appropriation for  
32 planning of a State-owned project provided in this Act, if a program required by Section  
33 3-602(d) of the State Finance and Procurement Article has not been submitted, then the  
34 State agency or institution responsible for the project shall submit a program to the  
35 Department of Budget and Management for approval before funds may be expended  
36 from the appropriation. For any appropriation for construction of a State-owned project  
37 provided in this Act, if preliminary plans and outline specifications required by Section  
38 3-602(f)(2)(i) of the State Finance and Procurement Article have not been prepared,  
39 then the State agency or institution responsible for the project shall submit preliminary  
40 plans and outline specifications to the Department of Budget and Management for  
41 approval before funds may be expended from the appropriation.

42 SECTION 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That no portion of the  
43 proceeds of a loan or any of the matching funds provided for a project funded under this  
44 Act may be used for the furtherance of sectarian religious instruction, or in connection

1 with the design, acquisition, construction, or equipping of any building used or to be used  
2 as a place of sectarian religious worship or instruction, or in connection with any program  
3 or department of divinity for any religious denomination. Upon the request of the Board  
4 of Public Works, a recipient of the proceeds of a loan under this Act shall submit  
5 evidence satisfactory to the Board that none of the proceeds of the loan or any matching  
6 funds has been or is being used for a purpose prohibited by this Act.

7 SECTION 11. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

8 (a) the Comptroller may advance funds from any loan fund account to any other  
9 loan fund account established pursuant to a general obligation loan enabling act, under  
10 the authority of which general obligation bonds have been issued, for any expenditure  
11 authorized by such Act.

12 (b) with the approval of the Board of Public Works, the Comptroller may advance  
13 funds to any loan fund account established pursuant to a general obligation loan enabling  
14 act, for which an approving legal opinion has been received by the Board, for any  
15 expenditure authorized by the Act, provided that the next sale of general obligation bonds  
16 shall include the issuance of bonds under the authority of that Act in an amount at least  
17 equivalent to the amount of the funds so advanced.

18 SECTION 12. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the net new debt to be  
19 authorized by legislation in Fiscal Year 1998 shall not exceed \$415,000,000, as evidenced  
20 by the following:
