1 AN ACT concerning

2 Morticians - Apprentice License

3 FOR the purpose of requiring that an applicant for an apprentice license to assist in the

4 practice of mortuary science complete a certain amount of the educational

5 requirements of <u>academic credits required for</u> a mortuary science program before

6 applying for a license; reducing the number of times that an apprentice license may

7 be renewed; reducing the amount of time an apprentice must work and the number

8 of embalmings and funerals an apprentice must assist with or participate in;

9 reducing the number of years amount of time that an applicant for a mortician

10 license may spend as an apprentice; and generally relating to an apprentice license

11 to assist in the practice of mortuary science.

- 22 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

3 (b) The Board shall examine all applications for licensure for the practice of 4 mortuary science and shall issue the mortician license to any person who:

5 (1) Is judged to be of good moral character;

6 (2) Has completed not less than 1 year and not more than [4] 2 years of
7 licensed apprenticeship, unless the Board allowed extensions for additional 1-year terms
8 A 1-YEAR LICENSED APPRENTICESHIP;

9 (3) Except as otherwise provided in this section, has graduated with an 10 associate of arts degree in mortuary science or its equivalent from a school accredited by 11 the American Board of Funeral Service Education or approved by the Board, or has 12 acquired at least an Associate of Arts Degree and completed a course in mortuary science 13 that is accredited by the American Board of Funeral Service Education or approved by 14 the Board;

(4) Has passed the national board examination administered by theConference of Funeral Service Examining Boards of the United States;

(5) Has passed a written examination on Maryland law and regulations
governing the practice of mortuary science and a practical examination demonstrating
competency in embalming and sanitary science; and

20 (6) Has submitted an application to the Board on the required form and has 21 paid a fee set by the Board.

(a) An individual shall obtain an apprentice license from the Board beforebeginning an apprenticeship in this State.

(c) [The applicant shall have graduated from 4 years of high school or have the equivalent of 12 years formal education certified by a State Department of Education or have attained an associate of arts, bachelor of science, or bachelor of arts degree from a college or university approved by an accrediting agency of the United States Department of Education. Certified evidence of a high school or general education diploma or a college degree shall be presented to the Board and made a part of the applicant's record.]

32 (1) THE APPLICANT MUST HAVE:

(1) COMPLETED TWO-THIRDS OF THE EDUCATIONAL REQUIREMENTS ACADEMIC CREDITS REQUIRED FOR A MORTUARY SCIENCE PROGRAM AT A SCHOOL ACCREDITED BY THE AMERICAN BOARD OF FUNERAL SERVICE EDUCATION OR APPROVED BY THE BOARD; AND

37 (II) A GRADE POINT AVERAGE OF 2.0 OR HIGHER.

38 (2) A CERTIFIED COPY OF THE COLLEGE TRANSCRIPT MUST BE39 SUBMITTED TO THE BOARD AND MADE A PART OF THE APPLICANT'S RECORD.

1	(d) (3) The practical experience of an apprentice shall include:	
2	(i) Participation in at least [25] 20 funerals:	
3 4	(ii) Assistance in the embalming of at least [25] 20 dead human bodies; and	
	(iii) Completion of [2,000] 1,000 working hours in a licensed funeral establishment under the direct supervision of a licensed mortician. Supervision may include instruction by other licensed morticians employed or supervised by the sponsor.

9 10	9 (e) (1) Before an apprentice license expires, the licensee may renew it for an 10 additional 1-year term only if the licensee:	
11 12	(i) Submits to the Board a renewal application on the form that the Board requires;	
13	(ii) Continues to participate in a training program; and	
14	(iii) Pays to the Board a renewal fee set by the Board.	
15 16	(2) An apprentice license may be renewed only [three] TWO times <u>ONE</u> <u>TIME</u> unless the Board allows extensions for additional 1-year terms.	
17 18	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1997.
