# 1 AN ACT concerning

# 2 State Board of Electrologists

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Board of Electrologists, after receiving notice

- 4 that an electrologist has opened an office, inspect the office to determine
- 5 compliance with certain regulations; requiring the Board to provide certain notice
- 6 before the inspection; authorizing the Board to take certain disciplinary actions if
- 7 the inspection is refused; repealing certain obsolete requirements related to
- 8 issuance of electrology licenses; setting certain educational standards for the
- 9 issuance after a certain date of an electrology license; requiring a certain
- 10 examination to be passed before certain licenses may be reactivated or reinstated;
- 11 and generally relating to the authority of the State Board of Electrologists.

# 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
