## 1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 Crimes - Reckless Homicide by Motor Vehicle

3 FOR the purpose of establishing the crime of reckless homicide by motor vehicle;

- 4 defining certain terms; establishing certain penalties; and generally relating to
- 5 reckless homicide by motor vehicle.

## 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 Article - Transportation

19 21-901.1.

20	(a) (1) A person is guilty of reckless driving if he drives a motor vehicle:	
21	[(1)] (I) In wanton or willful disregard for the safety of persons or property;	
22	or	
23	[(2)] (II) In a manner that indicates a wanton or willful disregard for the	
24	safety of persons or property.	

25	(2) A PERSON IS GUILTY OF RECKLESS HOMICIDE BY MOTOR VEHICLE
26 IF:	

27 (I) THE PERSON DRIVES A MOTOR VEHICLE:

1 1. IN WANTON OR WILLFUL DISREGARD FOR THE SAFETY 2 OF PERSONS OR PROPERTY; OR

3 2. IN A MANNER THAT INDICATES A WANTON OR WILLFUL4 DISREGARD FOR THE SAFETY OF PERSONS OR PROPERTY; AND

(II) THE ACT RESULTS IN THE DEATH OF ANOTHER PERSON.

6 (b) A person is guilty of negligent driving if he drives a motor vehicle in a careless7 or imprudent manner that endangers any property or the life or person of any individual.

8 27-101.

9 (R) ANY PERSON WHO IS CONVICTED OF A VIOLATION OF § 21-901.1(A)(2) OF 10 THIS ARTICLE IS SUBJECT TO A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$5,000 OR IMPRISONMENT 11 FOR NOT MORE THAN 5 YEARS OR BOTH.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 13 October 1, 1997.
