3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting the driver of a motor vehicle from operating, or

- 4 permitting the operation of, a sound amplification system in a certain manner under
- 5 certain conditions; specifying certain exceptions to the prohibition; specifying a civil
- 6 penalty; modifying a general criminal provision to reflect a certain exception;

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3 Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings

5 <u>Except as provided in § 4-402 of this subtitle, and subject to the venue provisions of</u>
6 <u>Title 6 of this article, the District Court has exclusive original civil jurisdiction in:</u>

7 (11) A proceeding for adjudication of a civil penalty for any violation under §

13 (A) IN THIS SECTION, "SOUND AMPLIFICATION SYSTEM" MEANS A COMPACT14 DISC PLAYER, A RADIO, A TAPE PLAYER, OR A SIMILAR DEVICE.

15 (B) THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO:

16 (1) AUTHORIZED EMERGENCY VEHICLES;

17 (2) VEHICLES OPERATED BY COMMUNICATIONS, ELECTRIC, GAS, OR18 WATER UTILITIES;

(3) A SOUND AMPLIFICATION SYSTEM OPERATED TO REQUEST
 ASSISTANCE OR TO WARN OF A HAZARDOUS SITUATION; OR

(4) UNLESS OTHERWISE PROHIBITED BY LOCAL LAW, A SOUND
 AMPLIFICATION SYSTEM USED FOR ADVERTISING, PARADES, OR FOR POLITICAL OR
 OTHER SPECIAL EVENTS.

(C) WHEN A MOTOR VEHICLE IS BEING OPERATED ON A HIGHWAY, THE
DRIVER OF THE VEHICLE MAY NOT OPERATE OR PERMIT THE OPERATION OF A
SOUND AMPLIFICATION SYSTEM FROM THE VEHICLE THAT CAN BE HEARD OUTSIDE
THE VEHICLE FROM 50 OR MORE FEET.

(D) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION IS SUBJECT
 TO A CIVIL PENALTY NOT EXCEEDING \$50.

31 (a) It is a misdemeanor for any person to violate any of the provisions of the
32 Maryland Vehicle Law unless the violation is:

33	(1) IS declared to be a felony by the Maryland Vehicle Law or by any other
34	law of this State; OR

35 (2) IS PUNISHABLE BY A CIVIL PENALTY UNDER THE APPLICABLE
 36 PROVISION OF THE MARYLAND VEHICLE LAW.

- 1 (b) Except as otherwise provided in this section, any person convicted of a
- 2 misdemeanor for the violation of any of the provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law is
- 3 subject to a fine of not more than \$500.

4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 5 October 1, 1997.
