17 (1992 Replacement Volume and 1996 Supplement)18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:20 **Article - Transportation**

22 (a) The Administration shall keep a record of each application or other document  
23 filed with it and each certificate or other official document that it issues.24 (b) (1) Except as otherwise provided by law, all records of the Administration  
25 are public records and open to public inspection during office hours.26 (2) Subject to paragraph (4) of this subsection, [in his discretion,] the  
27 Administrator may classify as confidential and not open to public inspection any record or  
28 record entry:

29 (i) That is over 5 years old; [or]

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1 (ii) That relates to any happening that occurred over 5 years earlier;  
2 OR

3 (III) THAT RELATES TO THE PRIVATE MOTOR VEHICLES OF A  
4 POLICE EMPLOYEE OR THE SECRETARY OF THE STATE POLICE.

5 (3) Any record or record entry of any age shall be open to inspection by  
6 authorized representatives of any federal, State, or local governmental agency.

7 (4) Subject to paragraph (3) of this subsection, the Administrator may not  
8 open to public inspection any record or record entry that is:

9 (i) All or part of a licensed driver's public driving record; and

10 (ii) Over 3 years old.

11 (5) Subject to paragraph (6) of this subsection, the Administration may not  
12 permit public inspection of a digital photographic image or signature of an individual, or  
13 the actual stored data thereof, recorded by the Administration.

14 (6) The Administration may make a digital photographic image or signature  
15 of an individual, or the actual stored data thereof, recorded by the Administration  
16 available to:

17 (i) The courts;

18 (ii) Criminal justice agencies;

19 (iii) Driver license authorities;

20 (iv) The individual;

21 (v) The individual's attorney; and

22 (vi) Third parties designated by the individual.

23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
24 October 1, 1997.
