Vehicle Laws - Confidentiality of Records - Private Motor Vehicles of Police Employees of the Department of State Police

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Motor Vehicle Administrator to classify as

- 5 confidential and not open to public inspection, records relating to the private motor
- 6 vehicles of police employees or the Secretary of the State Police, subject to a
- 7 <u>specified exception;</u> and making a stylistic change.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 20 Article Transportation
- 21 12-111.
- 22 (a) The Administration shall keep a record of each application or other document
- 23 filed with it and each certificate or other official document that it issues.

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1 2	(b) (1) Except as otherwise provided by law, all records of the Administration are public records and open to public inspection during office hours.
	(2) Subject to paragraph (4) of this subsection, [in his discretion,] the Administrator may classify as confidential and not open to public inspection any record or record entry:
6	(i) That is over 5 years old; [or]
7 8	(ii) That relates to any happening that occurred over 5 years earlier; OR
	(III) THAT RELATES TO THE PRIVATE MOTOR VEHICLES OF A POLICE EMPLOYEE OR THE SECRETARY OF THE STATE POLICE <u>EXCEPT FOR</u> <u>PURPOSES OF EXECUTION OF A JUDGMENT</u> .
12 13	(3) Any record or record entry of any age shall be open to inspection by authorized representatives of any federal, State, or local governmental agency.
14 15	(4) Subject to paragraph (3) of this subsection, the Administrator may not open to public inspection any record or record entry that is:
16	(i) All or part of a licensed driver's public driving record; and
17	(ii) Over 3 years old.
	(5) Subject to paragraph (6) of this subsection, the Administration may not permit public inspection of a digital photographic image or signature of an individual, or the actual stored data thereof, recorded by the Administration.
	(6) The Administration may make a digital photographic image or signature of an individual, or the actual stored data thereof, recorded by the Administration available to:
24	(i) The courts;
25	(ii) Criminal justice agencies;
26	(iii) Driver license authorities;
27	(iv) The individual;
28	(v) The individual's attorney; and
29	(vi) Third parties designated by the individual.
30 31	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1997.
