# A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

#### 2 Health Occupations - Alcohol and Drug Counselors - Certification

3 FOR the purpose of altering certain qualifications for certification as a certified associate

- 4 counselor-alcohol and drug; altering certain qualifications for the waiver of certain
- 5 requirements for certification as a certified professional counselor-alcohol and
- 6 drug, certified associate counselor-alcohol and drug, and certified supervised
- 7 counselor-alcohol and drug; correcting certain erroneous titles; and generally
- 8 relating to the qualifications for certification as an alcohol and drug counselor.

## 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 19 Article Health Occupations
- 20 17-302.4.

21 To qualify as a certified associate counselor-alcohol and drug an applicant shall:

(1) Hold a bachelor's degree from an accredited educational institutionapproved by the Board in a health or human services counseling field or have completed

- 24 a program of studies judged by the Board to be substantially equivalent in subject matter
- 25 and extent of training to such a program of studies;
- 26 (2) Have completed not less than 3 years, with a minimum of 2,000 hours of
- 27 supervised experience in alcohol and drug counseling approved by the Board, 2 years of
- 28 which shall have been completed after the award of the bachelor's degree;

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1 (3) Have a minimum of 20 credit hours in alcohol and drug counselor 2 training as defined in § 17-302.3(d)(4) of this title; and

3 (4) (I) Practice alcohol and drug counseling under the supervision of a
4 certified professional counselor-alcohol and drug or another health care provider
5 approved by the Board; OR

6 (II) PROVIDE ALCOHOL AND DRUG COUNSELING AS AN EMPLOYEE
7 OF AN AGENCY OR FACILITY THAT IS ACCREDITED BY THE JOINT COMMISSION ON
8 ACCREDITATION OF HEALTH CARE ORGANIZATIONS OR THAT IS CERTIFIED UNDER
9 TITLE 8, SUBTITLE 4 OF THE HEALTH - GENERAL ARTICLE.

(c) (1) The Board shall waive the requirements for certification as a certified
professional counselor-alcohol and drug under § 17-302.3 of this subtitle for any person
who:

14 (i) Has filed a letter of intent with the Board by July 1, [1997] 1998;

15 (ii) Holds a master's or doctoral degree in a health and human services

16 counseling field or has completed a program that the Board determines to be

17 substantially equivalent in subject matter and extent of training as a master's or doctoral

18 degree in a health and human services counseling field;

(iii) As of July 1, [1996] 1997, is certified as a certified chemical
 dependency counselor [or certified clinical supervisor], ITS EQUIVALENT, OR HIGHER
 by the Maryland Addiction Counselor Certification Board, ANOTHER STATE, THE
 CERTIFICATION COMMISSION OF THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF ALCOHOLISM
 AND DRUG ABUSE COUNSELORS, OR THE INTERNATIONAL CERTIFICATION
 RECIPROCITY CONSORTIUM, OR IS EMPLOYED IN THE CAPACITY OF A PROGRAM
 SPECIALIST I, II, III, OR ITS EQUIVALENT, OR HIGHER, IF THE PERSON IS EMPLOYED
 BY THE STATE, A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE, OR AN ENTITY THAT
 PROVIDES ALCOHOL AND DRUG COUNSELING SERVICES UNDER CONTRACT WITH
 THE STATE OR A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE; AND

(iv) Has completed not less than 3 years with a minimum of 3,000 hours
of supervised experience in alcohol and drug abuse counseling approved by the Board, 2
years of which shall have been completed after the award of the master's or doctoral
degree [; and

(v) Has, by July 1, 2001, successfully passed an examination approvedby the Board].

(2) The Board shall waive the requirements for certification as a certified
associate counselor-alcohol and drug for any person who has filed a letter of intent with
the Board by July 1, [1997] 1998 if:

(i) [The person holds a bachelor's degree in a health or human
 services counseling field or has completed a program that the Board determines to be
 substantially equivalent in subject matter and extent of training to a bachelor's degree in

41 a health or human services counseling field;

(ii)] The person, as of July 1, [1996] 1997, is certified as a certified
 chemical dependency counselor [or certified clinical supervisor], ITS EQUIVALENT, OR
 HIGHER, by the Maryland Addiction Counselor Certification Board, ANOTHER STATE,
 THE CERTIFICATION COMMISSION OF THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF
 ALCOHOLISM AND DRUG ABUSE COUNSELORS, OR THE INTERNATIONAL
 CERTIFICATION RECIPROCITY CONSORTIUM, or is employed in the capacity of a
 Program Specialist I, II, [or] III, or its equivalent, OR HIGHER, if the person is employed
 by the State, a political subdivision of the State, or an entity that provides alcohol and
 drug counseling services under contract with the State or a political subdivision of the
 State; and

11 [(iii)] (II) The person has completed not less than 3 years with a 12 minimum of 3,000 hours of supervised experience in alcohol and drug abuse counseling 13 approved by the Board [, 2 years of which shall have been completed after the award of 14 the bachelor's degree].

(3) The Board shall waive the requirements for certification as a certified
supervised counselor-alcohol and drug for any person who has filed a letter of intent with
the Board by July 1, [1997] 1998 if [:

(i) The person holds an associate's degree in health or human services
counseling or has completed a program that the Board determines to be substantially
equivalent in subject matter and extent of training to an associate's degree in health or
human services counseling; or

(ii) The] THE person, AS OF JULY 1, 1997, is certified as a certified
alcoholism counselor [or], certified drug counselor, OR HIGHER, by the Maryland
Addiction Counselor Certification Board, ANOTHER STATE, THE CERTIFICATION
COMMISSION OF THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF ALCOHOLISM AND DRUG ABUSE
COUNSELORS, OR THE INTERNATIONAL CERTIFICATION RECIPROCITY
CONSORTIUM, or is employed in the capacity of an Addiction Counselor II or III, or its
equivalent, OR HIGHER, if the person is employed by the State, a political subdivision of
the State, or an entity that provides alcohol and drug counseling services under contract
with the State or a political subdivision of the State.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding whether
 the services are provided within the scope of practice of a certified professional
 [counselor-drug and alcohol therapist] COUNSELOR-ALCOHOL AND DRUG, a certified
 [counselor-drug and alcohol therapist] ASSOCIATE COUNSELOR-ALCOHOL AND
 DRUG, or a certified [associate counselor-drug and alcohol therapist] SUPERVISED
 COUNSELOR-ALCOHOL AND DRUG, nothing in this Act may be construed to require a
 nonprofit health service plan, insurer, health maintenance organization, or person acting
 as a third party administrator to reimburse a certified professional [counselor-drug and
 alcohol therapist] SUPERVISED COUNSELOR-ALCOHOL AND DRUG, a certified [counselor-drug and
 alcohol therapist] SUPERVISED COUNSELOR-ALCOHOL AND DRUG, or a certified
 associate [counselor-drug and alcohol therapist] COUNSELOR-ALCOHOL AND DRUG.
