1 AN	ACT concerning
2 Ch	arles County - Length of Service Award Program - Benefits for Disability
	R the purpose of expanding the entitlement of benefits for any active qualified
4	volunteers of the Charles County volunteer fire companies, volunteer rescue squads,
5 6	and mobile intensive care units who have completed a specified minimum amount of service, who become totally and permanently disabled at any time and for any
7	reason during the course of volunteer service; repealing the requirement that
8	benefits be provided to active volunteers for disabilities exclusively suffered while
9	engaging in volunteer services; altering the requirement that the volunteer be
10	prevented from pursuing an occupation, and whose disability is certified in a certain
11	manner; requiring a certain review by the County Commissioners; and generally
12	relating to disability benefits under the Charles County Length of Service Award
13	Program.

19	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
20 M	ARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
21	Article 9 - Charles County
22 54-	9.
23	A. Any person who has served as a member of any Charles County Volunteer

24 Fire Company or Charles County Volunteer Rescue Squad is eligible to receive the

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- 1 benefits set forth in this Article if the person is certified in accordance with the provisions
- 2 of § 54-11 to have served as an active volunteer subsequent to December 31, 1973. Any
- 3 person who discontinued active volunteer service prior to January 1, 1974, may receive
- 4 credit for the service after being certified in accordance with the provisions of § 54-11.
- 5 B. Beginning January 1, 1974, any person who has reached the age of sixty (60)
- 6 years and who has completed a minimum of twenty-five (25) years of certified active
- 7 volunteer service with any Charles County Volunteer Fire Company or Volunteer Rescue
- 8 Squad, or combination thereof, shall receive benefits in the amount of one hundred
- 9 dollars (\$100.) per month for life. Payments shall begin on the first day of the first month
- 10 following eligibility. The program shall be administered by the County Commissioners of
- 11 Charles County, and payment shall be made directly to the volunteer entitled to such
- 12 benefits. Beginning July 1, 1984, and annually thereafter, this amount shall be increased
- 13 or decreased by an amount equal to the annual increase or decrease as reflected by the
- 14 consumer price index, using the published May figure each year. This amount shall not
- 15 exceed a four-percent increase or decrease per year and shall be cumulative.
- 16 C. An additional payment of two dollars (\$2.) per month shall be added to the
- 17 benefits described in Subsection B of this section for each full year of volunteer service in
- 18 excess of twenty-five (25) years. Beginning July 1, 1984, and annually thereafter, this
- 19 amount shall be increased or decreased by an amount equal to the annual increase or
- 20 decrease as reflected by the consumer price index, using the published May figure each
- 21 year. This amount shall not exceed a four-percent increase or decrease per year and shall
- 22 be cumulative. Beginning July 1, 1990, the amount payable monthly for each year in
- 23 excess of twenty-five (25) years shall be equal to four percent (4%) of the amount payable
- 24 under Subsection B of this section.
- D. In the event that any active volunteer becomes TOTALLY AND
- 26 PERMANENTLY disabled AT ANY TIME AND FOR ANY REASON during the course of
- 27 service as a volunteer fireman or rescue squadman while actively engaged in providing
- 28 such services and in the event that the disability prevents the volunteer from pursuing
- 29 [the volunteer's normal] ANY MEANINGFUL occupation and that the disability is of a
- 30 TOTAL AND permanent nature as certified by the State Workers' Compensation
- 31 Commission or other competent medical authority as designated by the County
- 32 Commissioners, then the volunteer is entitled to receive the benefits prescribed in
- 33 Subsection B of this section and any other benefits, regardless of age or length of service.
- 34 These benefits shall begin on the first day of the first month following the establishment
- 35 of the permanency of the disability.

36 E. IN THE EVENT THAT A QUALIFIED VOLUNTEER WHO HAS COMPLETED A

- 37 MINIMUM OF 25 YEARS OF CERTIFIED ACTIVE VOLUNTEER SERVICE WITH ANY
- 38 CHARLES COUNTY VOLUNTEER FIRE COMPANY OR VOLUNTEER RESCUE SQUAD, OR
- 39 COMBINATION THEREOF, SHALL BECOME PERMANENTLY AND TOTALLY DISABLED,
- 40 FOR ANY REASON, AND SUCH DISABILITY IS CERTIFIED BY THE STATE WORKERS'
- 41 COMPENSATION COMMISSION, OR ITS SUCCESSOR AGENCY, OR OTHER COMPETENT
- 42 MEDICAL AUTHORITY DESIGNATED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, THEN THAT
- 43 <u>VOLUNTEER SHALL BE ENTITLED TO RECEIVE BENEFITS EARNED AS PROVIDED</u>
- 44 UNDER SUBSECTIONS B AND C OF THIS SECTION, REGARDLESS OF AGE. THESE
- 45 BENEFITS SHALL BEGIN IN THE MONTH FOLLOWING CERTIFICATION OF DISABILITY.

- 1 E. F. In the event that any qualified volunteer shall die while receiving
- 2 benefits, then the surviving spouse is entitled to benefits equal to 75% of the volunteer's
- 3 benefits. This rate applies to any person who is receiving benefits on or before July 1,
- 4 1989, as well as to any person who begins to receive benefits after July 1, 1989. These
- 5 benefits shall terminate upon death or remarriage of the spouse.
- 6 F. G. In the event that a qualified volunteer dies prior to receiving any
- 7 benefits under this section, the surviving spouse is entitled to benefits equal to 75% of the
- 8 benefits earned by the deceased volunteer. This rate applies to any person who is
- 9 receiving benefits on or before July 1, 1989, as well as to any person who begins to receive
- 10 benefits after July 1, 1989. These benefits shall terminate upon death or remarriage. A
- 11 "qualified volunteer" is defined as:
- 12 (1) One who has completed 25 years of certified service; or
- 13 (2) One who is receiving benefits under Subsection $\mathbf{H} \mathbf{I}$ of this section.
- G. H. When a qualified volunteer dies, a death benefit of five thousand dollars
- 15 (\$5,000.) shall be paid to the volunteer's designated beneficiary.
- 16 H. I. In the event that any active volunteer fireman or squadman, herein
- 17 defined as one who has had at least two (2) years of qualifying service in the five (5)
- 18 preceding years, attains the age of seventy (70) years and fails to achieve the required
- 19 twenty-five (25) years of service, then the volunteer is entitled to a monthly benefit of the
- 20 number of years of certified service completed multiplied by four dollars (\$4.). These
- 21 benefits shall be payable in the normal manner.
- 22 <u>L. J.</u> When an unqualified volunteer is killed in the line of duty during the
- 23 course of service as a volunteer fireman or squadman after July 1, 1989, a death benefit of
- 24 five thousand dollars (\$5,000.) shall be paid to the unqualified volunteer's designated
- 25 beneficiary.
- 26 J. K. When receipts of funds from § 54-1D(3) exceed the costs of the benefits
- 27 described in Subsections A through I J of this section, the Board of Fire and Rescue
- 28 Commissioners may utilize the excess funds to provide additional benefits to those
- 29 persons eligible to receive benefits under this section.

- 31 A. (1) Commencing July 1, 1984, and annually thereafter, a cost of living review
- 32 shall be made by the County Commissioners to adjust the benefits provided under §
- 33 54-9B, C, D, E, F, [and] G, H, and I of this Article. The adjustment shall increase or
- 34 decrease the benefits according to an amount equal to the annual increase or decrease as
- 35 reflected by the current May consumer price index, but shall not exceed a four-percent
- 36 increase or decrease per year and shall be cumulative. Revised or reviewed benefits shall
- 37 commence on October 1 of the year.
- 38 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 39 July 1, 1997.

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
