- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

- 16 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 17 (2) "Portable pager" means any device carried, worn, or transported by an 18 individual to receive or communicate messages.
- 19 (3) "Public school property" means the grounds of any public school.
- 20 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, an individual may not
- 21 possess a portable pager on public school property.
- (c) This section does not apply to:
- 23 (1) Handicapped students using portable pagers for medical reasons;
- 24 (2) Law enforcement officers;
- 25 (3) Visitors on public school property for an authorized program, meeting,
- 26 or function;
- 27 (4) Faculty or staff members employed by a county board; and

3	1 (5) Members of any volunteer fire department, ambulance company, or 2 rescue squad, who are designated to possess a portable pager on public school property by 3 the chief of the volunteer fire department, ambulance company, or rescue squad, and the 4 school principal.

6 7	(1) ON A FIRST OFFENSE, MAY CONTACT A LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER; AND			
8 9	(2) ON A SECOND OR SUBSEQUENT OFFENSE, shall immediately contact a law enforcement officer.			
10 11	(e) A law enforcement officer contacted by school authorities in accordance with subsection (d) of this section:			
12 13	(1) Shall immediately inquire as to the reasons the individual possesses the pager; and			
14	(2) May arrest the violator.			
	(f) Any person who violates subsection (b) of this section is guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$2,500, imprisonment not exceeding 6 months, or both.
