## 2 Disabled Persons - Service Dog Trainers - Public Accommodations

- 3 FOR the purpose of providing that service dog trainers accompanied by a dog that is
- 4 being trained as a service dog have the same right of access, subject to certain
- 5 <u>conditions</u>, in certain public conveyances, places of public accommodation, and
- 6 housing accommodations as is given to blind or visually handicapped, deaf or
- 7 hearing impaired, or mobility impaired persons; prohibiting certain extra charges
- 8 for service dog trainers and their dogs; providing that certain service dog trainer
- 9 organizations may be liable for personal injuries or damages to premises under
- certain circumstances; establishing certain penalties for violations; requiring service
- dogs or service dog trainers accompanied by a dog that is being trained to display
- 12 <u>certain identification;</u> changing references from "guide dog" to "service dog";
- making stylistic corrections; and generally relating to service dog trainers and dogs
- being trained as service dogs.

## 1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 2 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 5 (c) The blind or the visually handicapped and the deaf or hearing impaired have 6 the same right as the persons not so handicapped to the full and free use of the streets, 7 highways, sidewalks, walkways, public buildings, public facilities, and other public places.
- 8 (d) (1) The blind or the visually handicapped and the deaf or hearing impaired
  9 are entitled to full and equal accommodations, advantages, facilities, and privileges of all
  10 common carriers, airplanes, motor vehicles, railroad trains, motor buses, streetcars, boats
  11 or other public conveyances or modes of transportation, hotels, lodging places, places of
  12 public accommodations, amusement, or resort, or other places to which the general public
  13 is invited, subject only to the conditions and limitations established by law and applicable
- 15 (2) A blind or visually handicapped pedestrian using a [guide] SERVICE
- 16 dog and not carrying a cane predominantly white or metallic in color (with or without a
- 17 red tip); or a deaf or hearing impaired pedestrian using a [guide] SERVICE dog not
- 18 wearing an orange license tag or orange collar and on a leash; or a blind or visually
- 19 handicapped pedestrian or a deaf or hearing impaired pedestrian using a [guide]
- 20 SERVICE dog in any of the places, accommodations or conveyances listed in paragraph
- 21 (1) of this subsection, SUBSECTION; OR A SERVICE DOG TRAINER ACCOMPANIED BY A
- 22 DOG THAT IS BEING TRAINED AS A SERVICE DOG DISPLAYING THE IDENTIFICATION
- 23 REQUIRED BY SUBSECTION (L) OF THIS SECTION, has all the rights and privileges

- 25 (3) The failure of a blind or visually handicapped pedestrian to carry a cane
- 26 predominantly white or metallic in color (with or without a red tip) or a deaf or hearing
- 27 impaired pedestrian to use a [guide] SERVICE dog wearing an orange license tag, orange
- 28 collar and on a leash, or to use a [guide] SERVICE dog in any of the places,
- 29 accommodations, or conveyances listed in paragraph (1) of this subsection shall not be
- 30 held to constitute contributory negligence per se.
- 31 (f) Every blind or visually handicapped person or deaf or hearing impaired
- 32 person has the right to be accompanied by a [guide] SERVICE dog, especially trained for
- 33 the purpose, in any of the places listed in paragraph (1) of subsection (d) of this section,
- 34 without being required to pay an extra charge for the [guide] SERVICE dog; however,
- 35 [he] THE PERSON is liable for any damage done to the premises or facilities by [his]
- 36 THE SERVICE dog.
- 37 (g) (1) Any person or persons, firm, or corporation, or the agent of any person
- 38 or persons, firm, or corporation, who denies or interferes with admittance to or
- 39 enjoyment of the public facilities enumerated in this section, or otherwise interferes with
- 40 the rights of a blind or visually handicapped person or a deaf or hearing impaired person
- 41 under this section, is guilty of a misdemeanor and subject upon conviction to a fine not
- 42 exceeding \$500 for each offense.

| 3<br>4<br>5          | (2) In addition to any other remedy provided under this Code for a violation of this article, any individual, firm, or corporation, or the agent of any individual, firm, or corporation, who denies or interferes with admittance to or enjoyment of the public facilities enumerated in this section, or otherwise interferes with the rights of a blind or visually handicapped person or a deaf or hearing impaired person under this section, may be subject to a civil action for injunctive relief.   |
