2 Automated Dialing Systems - Availability of Sender

- 3 FOR the purpose of prohibiting a sender of a telephone call using certain automated
- 4 dialing systems from initiating the call unless the sender is on the line and ready to
- 5 respond to the recipient at the time of the call, subject to certain exceptions; and
- 6 providing certain penalties for a violation of this Act.
- 7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 Article 78 - Public Service Commission Law

15 55C.

- 16 (a) A person may not utilize an automated dialing or push-button or
- 17 tone-activated address signaling system with a prerecorded message for the purpose of
- 18 soliciting persons to purchase, lease, or rent goods or services, offering a gift or prize,
- 19 conducting a poll, or requesting survey information where results are to be used directly
- 20 for the purpose of soliciting persons to purchase, lease, or rent goods or services.
- 21 (b) The sender of an automated dialing, push-button, or tone-activated address
- 22 signaling call shall disconnect the prerecorded message machine from the recipient's
- 23 telephone line within 5 seconds after the termination of the call by either the person
- 24 calling or the person called.
- 25 (c) A SENDER OF AN AUTOMATED DIALING, PUSH-BUTTON, OR
- 26 TONE-ACTIVATED ADDRESS SIGNALING CALL MAY NOT INITIATE THE CALL UNLESS
- 27 THE SENDER IS ON THE LINE AND READY TO RESPOND TO THE RECIPIENT AT THE
- 28 TIME OF THE CALL.
- 29 (D) This section does not apply to:

- 1 (1) An agency of federal, State, or local government that uses an automated 2 dialing prerecorded message machine for emergency purposes; or
- 3 (2) Any person who has a preexisting business relationship with, or the 4 consent of, the person called.
- 5 [(d)] (E) A person who violates the provisions of this section is guilty of a 6 misdemeanor and on conviction is subject to a fine not exceeding \$1,000 for the first
- 7 offense and not exceeding \$5,000 for each additional or subsequent offense.
- 8 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 9 October 1, 1997.
