1 AN ACT concerning

2 Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission - Minority Business

3 Enterprise Utilization Program

4 MC/PG 45-97

5 FOR the purpose of continuing the authority of the Maryland-National Capital Park and
6 Planning Commission (MNCPPC) to establish and administer a Minority Business
7 Enterprise Utilization Program for the award of contracts for goods, services, and
8 construction under certain circumstances through a specified date; requiring the
9 MNCPPC to issue certain reports and to make certain recommendations regarding
10 the Minority Business Enterprise Utilization Program to certain legislative
11 delegations; altering a certain termination provision; and generally relating to the
12 Minority Business Enterprise Utilization Program under the MNCPPC.

1 Chapter 256 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1995
2 Section 2

3 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
4 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

5 **Article 28 - Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission**

6 2-301.

7 (a) The Commission shall undertake and complete an internal and market
8 fact-finding study to assess the appropriate scope of a minority business enterprise
9 program for the Commission.

10 (b) The results of the fact-finding study, including statistical data, supporting
11 documentation, and reports, shall be reported to the Prince George's County and
12 Montgomery County Delegations to the General Assembly by December 15, [1990] 2000.

13 2-302.

14 In this subtitle "minority" means any group that the Commission finds, after
15 appropriate study, to be socially or economically disadvantaged as a result of
16 discrimination in the public or private sector that has affected the group's utilization and
17 participation in contracting or procurement with the Commission.

18 2-303.

19 If the Commission determines that a program is necessary to remedy discrimination
20 against minority business enterprises in contracting or procurement with the Commission,
21 the Commission shall establish a Minority Business Utilization Program to facilitate
22 participation of responsible certified minority business enterprises in contracts awarded
23 by the Commission for goods, services, and construction.

24 2-304.

25 (a) The Commission shall adopt regulations for the operation of the Minority
26 Business Enterprise Utilization Program established under this subtitle.

27 (b) The regulations shall include provisions for:

28 (1) Acceptance of the certification of minority business enterprises that
29 have been certified by the State certification agency designated under § 14-303 of the
30 State Finance and Procurement Article;

31 (2) Waiver of all or part of the Program provisions for a specific contract if
32 the Commission determines that:

33 (i) Minority business enterprises are unavailable; or

34 (ii) The application of the Program to the contract conflicts with the
35 Commission's overall objectives and responsibilities;

36 (3) Graduation of a minority business enterprise from the Program if the
37 Commission determines that the minority business enterprise no longer requires the
38 assistance or benefits offered by the Program;

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1 (4) Termination of the Program when the Program is no longer necessary to
2 remedy the effects of past discrimination;

3 (5) Acceptance of the decisions of any other certification program that, in
4 the judgment of the Commission, assures that certified minority business enterprises are
5 legitimate;

6 (6) Minority participation in subcontracting as well as direct contracting;
7 and

8 (7) Application of reasonable preferences to certified minority business
9 enterprises in evaluating competitive bids or proposals.

10 2-305.

11 On or before August 15, [1996] 2000, the Commission shall issue a report that:

12 (1) Evaluates the implementation and administration of the Program
13 through May 31, [1996] 2000; and

14 (2) Makes appropriate recommendations to the Montgomery County and
15 Prince George's County Delegations of the House of Delegates and Senate of Maryland.

16 **Chapter 256 of the Acts of 1995**

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
18 October 1, 1995. [At] IT SHALL REMAIN EFFECTIVE FOR A PERIOD OF 6 YEARS AND,
19 AT the end of September 30, [1997] 2001, and with no further action required by the
20 General Assembly,[Article 28, § 2-305] THE MINORITY BUSINESS ENTERPRISE
21 UTILIZATION PROGRAM UNDER ARTICLE 28, §§ 2-301 THROUGH 2-305 of the
22 Annotated Code of Maryland shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.

23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
24 October 1, 1997.
