3	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
5	Article 28 - Maryland-National Capital Park and Planning Commission
6	2-301.
	(a) The Commission shall undertake and complete an internal and market fact-finding study to assess the appropriate scope of a minority business enterprise program for the Commission.
	(b) The results of the fact-finding study, including statistical data, supporting documentation, and reports, shall be reported to the Prince George's County and Montgomery County Delegations to the General Assembly by December 15, [1990] 2000.

16	In this subtitle "minority" means any group that the Commission finds, after appropriate study, to be socially or economically disadvantaged as a result of discrimination in the public or private sector that has affected the group's utilization and participation in contracting or procurement with the Commission.

21 22	If the Commission determines that a program is necessary to remedy discrimination against minority business enterprises in contracting or procurement with the Commission, the Commission shall establish a Minority Business Utilization Program to facilitate participation of responsible certified minority business enterprises in contracts awarded by the Commission for goods, services, and construction.

25 26	(a) The Commission shall adopt regulations for the operation of the Minority Business Enterprise Utilization Program established under this subtitle.
27	(b) The regulations shall include provisions for:
	(1) Acceptance of the certification of minority business enterprises that have been certified by the State certification agency designated under § 14-303 of the State Finance and Procurement Article;
31 32	(2) Waiver of all or part of the Program provisions for a specific contract if the Commission determines that:
33	(i) Minority business enterprises are unavailable; or
34 35	(ii) The application of the Program to the contract conflicts with the Commission's overall objectives and responsibilities;
	(3) Graduation of a minority business enterprise from the Program if the Commission determines that the minority business enterprise no longer requires the assistance or benefits offered by the Program;

1 2	(4) Termination of the Program when the Program is no longer necessary to remedy the effects of past discrimination;	
	(5) Acceptance of the decisions of any other certification program that, in the judgment of the Commission, assures that certified minority business enterprises are legitimate;	
6 7	(6) Minority participation in subcontracting as well as direct contracting; and	
8 9	(7) Application of reasonable preferences to certified minority business enterprises in evaluating competitive bids or proposals.

11	On or before August 15, [1996] 2000, the Commission shall issue a report that:	
12 13	(1) Evaluates the implementation and administration of the Program through May 31, [1996] 2000; and	
14 15	(2) Makes appropriate recommendations to the Montgomery County and Prince George's County Delegations of the House of Delegates and Senate of Maryland.
