5	FOR the purpose of requiring the Washington Suburban Sanitary Commission (WSSC) to
6	supply water and sewer services in certain amounts without charge to certain
7	charitable institutions; and altering and adding certain definitions.

13	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14	MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
15	Article 29 - Washington Suburban Sanitary District

17	(a) (1) (I) In this subsection[,] THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE
18	MEANINGS INDICATED.
19	(II) ["charitable] "CHARITABLE institution" means an institution:
20	[(i)] 1. That is located in Montgomery County or Prince George's
21	County; [and]
22	[(ii)] 2. Whose purpose is primarily charitable; AND
23	3. THAT HAS OBTAINED NONPROFIT STATUS UNDER §
24	501(C)(3) OF THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE.
25 26	(III) "DAY PROGRAM FACILITY" MEANS A FACILITY OF A CHARITABLE INSTITUTION THAT:

	1. IS LICENSED OR WAIVED BY THE DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES ADMINISTRATION UNDER § 7-903 OF THE HEALTH - GENERAL ARTICLE; AND
	2. PROVIDES DAY HABILITATION SERVICES OR VOCATIONAL SERVICES TO INDIVIDUALS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES AT THE FACILITY SITE.
7 8	(2) If a charitable institution does not discriminate against the entrance or care of residents of Montgomery County or Prince George's County, the WSSC shall:
9 10	(i) 1. Supply without cost up to 100 gallons of water per day for each inmate of the charitable institution; OR
	$2. \ \ \text{IN THE CASE OF A DAY PROGRAM FACILITY, SUPPLY UP} \\ \ \ \text{TO 25 GALLONS OF WATER PER DAY FOR EACH CLIENT AT THE SITE OF THE DAY} \\ \ \ \text{PROGRAM FACILITY; and} $
14 15	(ii) Not make a sewer usage charge for or on the account of item (i) of this paragraph.
16 17	(3) However, the WSSC may assess against the charitable institution a charge:
18 19	(i) To cover the cost of reading the water meter, which the charitable institution shall install and maintain at its own cost; and
22	(ii) For sewer usage and the current rate for water used in excess of [100 gallons per day for each inmate of the charitable institution] THE AMOUNT OF WATER SUPPLIED WITHOUT COST IN ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH (2)(I) OF THIS SUBSECTION.
	(b) (1) This subsection does not invalidate, without the consent of a municipality located in the sanitary district, any contract between the WSSC and the municipality.
29	(2) Except as provided in paragraph (3) of this subsection, the WSSC shall charge and collect its usual water rate, including a ready to serve charge, for all water used by this State, Montgomery County, Prince George's County, or any municipal authority in Montgomery County or Prince George's County.
33 34	(3) Notwithstanding any law or ordinance to the contrary, a fire department or rescue squad that is recognized by Montgomery County or Prince George's County or that is maintained and operated by a municipal authority in Montgomery County or Prince George's County is exempt from water rates, meter service charges, and sewer usage charges.
36 37	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 1997.
