However, the certifying agency is not 23 required to accept this claim if it determines that the claim is invalid. 24 (ii) An eligible minority business enterprise shall be an independent 25 business. The ownership and control by minorities shall be real, substantial, and 26 continuing and shall go beyond the pro forma ownership of the business as reflected in its 27 ownership documents. The minority owners shall enjoy the customary incidents of 28 ownership and shall share in the risks and profits commensurate with their ownership 29 interests as demonstrated by an examination of the substance rather than form of 30 arrangements. Recognition of the business as a separate entity for tax or corporate 31 purposes is not necessarily sufficient for recognition as a minority business enterprise. In 32 determining whether a potential minority business enterprise is an independent business, 33 the certifying agency shall consider all relevant factors, including the date the business 34 was established, the adequacy of its resources for the work of the contract, and the degree 35 to which financial, equipment leasing, and other relationships with nonminority 36 businesses vary from industry practice.

(vii) The certifying agency shall give special consideration to the 20 21 following additional circumstances in determining eligibility: 22 1. Newly formed businesses and businesses whose ownership or 23 control has changed since the date of the advertisement of the contract are closely 24 scrutinized to determine the reasons for the timing of the formation of or change in the 25 businesses; 26 2. A previous or continuing employer-employee relationship 27 between or among present owners is carefully reviewed to ensure that the 28 employee-owner has management responsibilities and capabilities discussed in this 29 section; and 30 3.
