1 2	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
3	Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings

	(i) "Court" means the circuit court of a county or Baltimore City sitting as the juvenile court. In Montgomery County, it means the District Court sitting as the juvenile court AND FOLLOWING THE APPLICABLE RULES OF THE CIRCUIT COURT.

9	(a) The court has exclusive original jurisdiction over:
10 11	(1) A child alleged to be delinquent, in need of supervision, in need of assistance or who has received a citation for a violation; and
