- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 Each county board shall:

16 (1) To the best of its ability carry out the applicable provisions of this article 17 and the bylaws, rules, regulations, and policies of the State Board;

(2) Maintain throughout its county a reasonably uniform system of publicschools that is designed to provide quality education and equal educational opportunityfor all children;

21 (3) Subject to this article and to the applicable bylaws, rules, and regulations 22 of the State Board, determine, with the advice of the county superintendent, the

(a) Subject to the applicable provisions of this article, the Board of SchoolCommissioners of Baltimore City may:
7 (1) Examine, appoint, and remove teachers;
8 (2) Set teacher qualifications;
9 (3) Subject to the approval of the Mayor and City Council, set teacher 10 salaries; and
11 (4) Select textbooks for the public schools in Baltimore City, except that the 12 textbooks may not contain anything of a sectarian or partisan character.
(b) (1) The Board of School Commissioners shall report annually to the StateBoard on the condition of the schools under its jurisdiction.
