7	(5) For the sale following the execution or attachment of personal property: Three percent of the first \$5,000; two percent of the second \$5,000; and one percent of any amount in excess of \$10,000. The sheriff shall collect a minimum of \$15 and a maximum of \$500 under the provisions of this paragraph.
11	(6) For the sale following the execution or attachment of real property: One and one-half percent of the first \$5,000; one percent of the second \$5,000; and one-half of one percent of any amount in excess of \$10,000. The sheriff shall collect a minimum of \$1.50 and a maximum of \$250 under the provisions of this paragraph.

26	(6) For the sale following the execution or attachment of real property: 1.5 percent of the first \$5,000; 1 percent of the second \$5,000; and one-half of 1 percent of any amount in excess of \$10,000. 	[(c)] (B) (1) If the sheriff incurs expenses for the purpose of <del>STORING,</del> conserving <del>, [or]</del> protecting <del>, OR [the seized] SEIZING</del> property, the sheriff shall be reimbursed for the expense.
