- 3 FOR the purpose of providing for an alternate pension selection for members of the
- 4 Employees' Pension System and the Teachers' Pension System; making the selection
- 5 optional for certain members and mandatory for certain other members; providing
- for the member contribution rate, the benefits, and the cost-of-living adjustment
- 7 for members subject to the alternate pension selection; requiring that certain
- 8 members who elect to be subject to the alternate pension selection have at least a
- 9 certain number of years of eligibility service to receive certain benefits; and
- generally relating to an alternate pension selection for members of the Employees'
- Pension System and the Teachers' Pension System.

23 (a) A member may retire with a normal service retirement allowance if:
24 (1) the member completes and submits a written application to the Board of 25 Trustees stating the date when the member desires to retire; and
26 (2) on or before the date of retirement, the member:
27 (i) has at least 30 years of eligibility service; or
28 (ii) has attained the age and the years of eligibility service as follows:

30 62 with 5
31 63 with 4

5 (C) ON RETIREMENT UNDER THIS SECTION, A MEMBER WHO IS SUBJECT TO 6 THE ALTERNATE PENSION SELECTION UNDER PART II OF THIS SUBTITLE IS 7 ENTITLED TO RECEIVE A NORMAL SERVICE RETIREMENT ALLOWANCE THAT 8 EQUALS THE NUMBER OF YEARS OF THE MEMBER'S CREDITABLE SERVICE 9 MULTIPLIED BY 1.5% OF THE MEMBER'S AVERAGE FINAL COMPENSATION THAT 10 EXCEEDS THE SOCIAL SECURITY INTEGRATION LEVEL.

12 (a) A member may retire with an early service retirement allowance if:
13 (1) the member completes and submits a written application to the Board of 14 Trustees stating the date when the member desires to retire; and
15 (2) on or before the date of retirement, the member:
16 (i) has at least 15 years but less than 30 years of eligibility service; and
17 (ii) is at least 55 but less than 62 years old.
18 (b) On retirement under this section, a member is entitled to receive an early 19 service retirement allowance that equals the normal service retirement allowance under § 20 23-401 of this subtitle, reduced by 0.5% for each month that the member's early 21 retirement date precedes the date the member will be 62 years old.
