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## CHAPTER

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1 AN ACT concerning
2 State Retirement and Pension System - Board of Trustees - Membership
3 FOR the purpose of altering the eligibility requirements for membership on the Board of
4 Trustees for the State Retirement and Pension System to require a certain number 5 of the members to be retirees and a certain number of the members to be employed 6 members of certain systems; requiring a special election to be held under certain 7 circumstances; and generally relating to membership on the Board of Trustees.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
15 Article - State Personnel and Pensions

17 (a) The Board of Trustees consists of the following 14 trustees:
(1) the Secretary of Budget and Management, ex officio;
(2) the State Comptroller, ex officio;
(3) the State Superintendent of Schools, ex officio;

(4) the State Treasurer, ex officio, who may appoint a deputy treasurer as
(8) two trustees who are members or retirees of the State Police Retirement 2 System, of whom one is a retiree of the State Police Retirement System at the time of 3 election under subsection (b) of this section;
(9) one trustee who represents the interests of participating governmental 5 units in the Employees' Pension System and the Employees' Retirement System; and
(10) two trustees who:
(i) represent the interests of the public;
(ii) are not members of any of the several systems; and
(iii) are knowledgeable in the administration and operation of pension 0 systems and trust funds.

31 (b) (1) (i) The trustees who are members or retirees of the Correctional
32 Officers' Retirement System, the Employees' Pension System, the Employees'
33 Retirement System, the Judges' Retirement System, the Legislative Pension Plan, the
Local Fire and Police System, or the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension Plan shall be
elected by the members and the retirees of those State systems.
(ii) The trustees who are members or retirees of the Teachers' Pension

2 Retirement System shall be elected by the members and the retirees of that State system.

3 (iv) The elections shall be conducted under regulations that the Board
4 of Trustees adopts.

5 (v) A trustee is not eligible for reelection if]:

1. the trustee becomes a retiree of the Correctional Officers'

7 Retirement System, the Employees' Pension System, the Employees' Retirement System, 8 the Judges' Retirement System, the Legislative Pension Plan, the Local Fire and Police
9 System, or the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension Plan, and the other elected trustee for 10 those State systems is already a retiree of one of those State systems;

12 System or the Teachers' Retirement System and the other elected trustee for those State
3 systems is already a retiree of one of those State systems; or

5 System and the other elected trustee is already a retiree of that State system.
(2) The trustee who represents the interests of participating subdivisions in
the Employees' Pension System and the Employees' Retirement System shall be
8 appointed by the Governor.
(3) The trustees who represent the public shall be appointed by the

Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate.
(d) (1) (i) The term of an appointed or elected trustee is 4 years.
(ii) Trustees who represent the public serve staggered 4 -year terms.
(2) (I) A trustee who is a member but not a retiree of [the Correctional

Officers' Retirement System, the Employees' Pension System, the Employees'
Retirement System, the Judges' Retirement System, the Legislative Pension Plan, the
Local Fire and Police System, the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension Plan,] the State
Police Retirement System [, the Teachers' Pension System, or the Teachers' Retirement
System] at the time of election of the trustee may complete the term of office even if, during the term, the trustee becomes a retiree of the State system of which the trustee was a member at the time of election.
(II) A TRUSTEE WHO IS A MEMBER BUT NOT A RETIREE OF THE CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS' RETIREMENT SYSTEM, THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM, THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM, THE JUDGES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM, THE LEGISLATIVE PENSION PLAN, THE LOCAL FIRE AND POLICE SYSTEM, THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS' PENSION PLAN, THE TEACHERS' PENSION SYSTEM, OR THE TEACHERS' RETIREMENT SYSTEM AT THE TIME OF ELECTION OF THE TRUSTEE MAY NOT COMPLETE THE TERM OF OFFICE IF, DURING THE TERM, THE TRUSTEE BECOMES A RETIREE OF THE STATE SYSTEM OF WHICH THE TRUSTEE WAS A MEMBER AT THE TIME OF ELECTION.
(III) IF A TRUSTEE UNDER SUBPARAGRAPH (II) OF THIS

41 SUBSECTION RETIRES WHILE IN OFFICE, THE TRUSTEE SHALL VACATE THE OFFICE

1 AS OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF RETIREMENT AND AN ELECTION SHALL BE HELD IN
2 ACCORDANCE WITH SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION TO FILL THE VACANCY FOR
3 THE UNEXPIRED TERM.

4
(3) A vacancy in the office of a trustee shall be filled for the unexpired term

5 in the same manner as the office was previously filled.

6
(4) At the end of a term, a trustee continues to serve until a successor is

7 appointed or elected.

8
(5) A trustee who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for the 9 rest of the term and until a successor is selected and qualifies.

10 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
11 October 1, 1997.
