BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 13 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: **Article - State Personnel and Pensions** 15 16 21-104. 17 (a) The Board of Trustees consists of the following 14 trustees: (1) the Secretary of Budget and Management, ex officio; 18

(2) the State Comptroller, ex officio;

(3) the State Superintendent of Schools, ex officio;

(4) the State Treasurer, ex officio, who may appoint a deputy treasurer as

33 34	(b) (1) (i) The trustees who are members or retirees of the Correctional Officers' Retirement System, the Employees' Pension System, the Employees' Retirement System, the Judges' Retirement System, the Legislative Pension Plan, the Local Fire and Police System, or the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension Plan shall be elected by the members and the retirees of those State systems.
	(ii) The trustees who are members or retirees of the Teachers' Pension System or the Teachers' Retirement System shall be elected by the members and the retirees of those State systems.

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1 (iii) The trustees who are members or retirees of the State Police 2 Retirement System shall be elected by the members and the retirees of that State system.
3 (iv) The elections shall be conducted under regulations that the Board 4 of Trustees adopts.
5 (v) A trustee is not eligible for reelection if[:
1. the trustee becomes a retiree of the Correctional Officers' Retirement System, the Employees' Pension System, the Employees' Retirement System, the Judges' Retirement System, the Legislative Pension Plan, the Local Fire and Police System, or the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension Plan, and the other elected trustee for those State systems is already a retiree of one of those State systems;

3.] the trustee becomes a retiree of the State Police Retirement

16 (2) The trustee who represents the interests of participating subdivisions in 17 the Employees' Pension System and the Employees' Retirement System shall be 18 appointed by the Governor.
19 (3) The trustees who represent the public shall be appointed by the 20 Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate.
21 (d) (1) (i) The term of an appointed or elected trustee is 4 years.
22 (ii) Trustees who represent the public serve staggered 4-year terms.
23 (2) (I) A trustee who is a member but not a retiree of [the Correctional
24 Officers' Retirement System, the Employees' Pension System, the Employees'
25 Retirement System, the Judges' Retirement System, the Legislative Pension Plan, the
 Local Fire and Police System, the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension Plan, the State Police Retirement System [, the Teachers' Pension System, or the Teachers' Retirement
28 System] at the time of election of the trustee may complete the term of office even if,
29 during the term, the trustee becomes a retiree of the State system of which the trustee
30 was a member at the time of election.
31 (II) A TRUSTEE WHO IS A MEMBER BUT NOT A RETIREE OF THE
32 CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS' RETIREMENT SYSTEM, THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION
33 SYSTEM, THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM, THE JUDGES' RETIREMENT
34 SYSTEM, THE LEGISLATIVE PENSION PLAN, THE LOCAL FIRE AND POLICE SYSTEM,
35 THE LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS' PENSION PLAN, THE TEACHERS' PENSION
