(4) (5) "PUBLIC OFFICIAL" MEANS ANY FEDERAL, STATE, OR LOCALLY 20 ELECTED OFFICIAL WITH OVERALL EXECUTIVE RESPONSIBILITY IN THE 21 JURISDICTION IN WHICH AN EMERGENCY, DISASTER, OR CATASTROPHIC EVENT HAS 22 OCCURRED. 23 (5) (6) "PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICIAL" MEANS ANY APPOINTED OR 24 ELECTED FEDERAL, STATE, OR LOCAL OFFICIAL WITH OVERALL EXECUTIVE 25 RESPONSIBILITY TO COORDINATE PUBLIC SAFETY IN THE JURISDICTION IN WHICH 26 AN EMERGENCY, DISASTER, OR CATASTROPHIC EVENT HAS OCCURRED. 27 (B) A PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER IS NOT LIABLE <u>PERSONALLY LIABLE IN</u> 28 <u>DAMAGES BEYOND THE LIMITS OF ANY APPLICABLE INSURANCE OR</u> 29 <u>SELF-INSURANCE</u> FOR ANY PERSONAL INJURY, WRONGFUL DEATH, PROPERTY 30 DAMAGE, OR OTHER LOSS CAUSED BY AN ACT, ERROR, OR OMISSION OF THE 31 PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER WHILE PRACTICING ENGINEERING WITH REGARD TO 32 ANY STRUCTURE, BUILDING, PIPING, OR OTHER ENGINEERED SYSTEM, EITHER 33 PUBLICLY OR PRIVATELY OWNED, IF: 34 (1) THE ACT, ERROR, OR OMISSION WAS NOT WANTON, WILLFUL, OR 35 INTENTIONAL INTENTIONALLY TORTIOUS, OR GROSSLY NEGLIGENT; AND (2) THE PRACTICE OF ENGINEERING WAS PERFORMED: 36 37 (I) VOLUNTARILY AND WITHOUT COMPENSATION; 38 (II) AT THE SCENE OF A DECLARED NATIONAL, STATE, OR LOCAL

39 EMERGENCY CAUSED BY A MAJOR EARTHQUAKE, HURRICANE, TORNADO, FIRE, 40 EXPLOSION, COLLAPSE, OR SIMILAR DISASTER OR CATASTROPHIC EVENT; AND

- 1 (III) AT THE REQUEST OF A PUBLIC OFFICIAL, LAW ENFORCEMENT
- $2\,$ OFFICIAL, PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICIAL, OR $\underline{\text{FIRE OFFICIAL, OR}}$ BUILDING INSPECTION
- 3 OFFICIAL, ACTING IN AN OFFICIAL CAPACITY.
- 4 (C) THE IMMUNITY PROVIDED BY THIS SECTION APPLIES ONLY TO THE
- 5 VOLUNTARY PRACTICE OF ENGINEERING PERFORMED WITHIN 90 DAYS AFTER THE
- 6 EMERGENCY, DISASTER, OR CATASTROPHIC EVENT, UNLESS EXTENDED BY AN
- 7 EXECUTIVE ORDER ISSUED BY THE GOVERNOR UNDER THE GOVERNOR'S
- 8 EMERGENCY EXECUTIVE POWERS WHILE A DECLARED STATE OF EMERGENCY IS IN

- 10 (D) (1) THIS SECTION DOES NOT CREATE, AND MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED AS
- 11 CREATING, A NEW CAUSE OF ACTION OR SUBSTANTIVE LEGAL RIGHT AGAINST A

- 13 (2) THIS SECTION DOES NOT AFFECT, AND MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED AS
- 14 <u>AFFECTING, ANY IMMUNITIES FROM CIVIL LIABILITY OR DEFENSES ESTABLISHED</u>
- 15 BY ANY OTHER PROVISIONS OF THE CODE OR AVAILABLE AT COMMON LAW, TO
- 16 WHICH A PROFESSIONAL ENGINEER MAY BE ENTITLED.
- 17 <u>SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall be construed</u>

- 19 application to any cause of action arising before the effective date of this Act.
