## A BILL ENTITLED

## 1 AN ACT concerning

## 2 House of Delegates Scholarship Programs - Abolition

3 F	FOR the purpose of abolishing the House of Delegates Scholarship Program; transferring
4	certain appropriated scholarship funds in the House of Delegates program, after a
5	certain date, to the Educational Excellence Award Program; permitting the
6	recipients of certain scholarships to continue to receive those awards under certain
7	conditions; directing the Governor to include certain funds in the State budget for
8	the Educational Excellence Award Program commencing with the Fiscal Year 1998
9	budget, subject to certain conditions; requiring that certain additional funds
10	appropriated in the State budget be distributed under the Educational Excellence
11	Award Program in a certain manner; and generally relating to the abolition of the
12	House of Delegates Scholarship Program.

- 20 WHEREAS, The General Assembly desires to terminate the House of Delegates
- 21 Scholarship Program; and
- 22 WHEREAS, It is necessary to achieve an orderly phaseout of this legislative
- 23 scholarship program in order to ensure that students served by the program who are in
- 24 need of financial assistance to attend higher education institutions are not harmed by the
- 25 termination of the program on October 1, 1997; and
- 26 WHEREAS, It is the intent of the General Assembly that the student populations
- 27 currently served by the House of Delegates Scholarship Program will continue to be
- 28 served by the Educational Excellence Award Program; now, therefore,

1 2	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
3	Article - Education
4	[Subtitle 5. Delegate Scholarships.]
5	[18-501.
6 7	(a) There is a program of Delegate Scholarships in this State that are awarded under this subtitle.
8	(b) A scholarship awarded under this subtitle may be used at:
9 10	(1) An eligible institution for a program of undergraduate, graduate, or professional studies;
	(2) An accredited undergraduate, graduate, or professional institution outside the State, if the applicant will be studying in an academic area that is not available in this State; and
16	(3) A private career school within the State that is approved by the Maryland Higher Education Commission under § 11-202 of this article and that is accredited by a national accrediting association that is approved by the United States Department of Education.
20	(c) Moneys appropriated to the Commission for scholarships awarded under this section that are not used by the end of the fiscal year shall be retained by the Commission for use by the awarding Delegate in the Delegate Scholarship Program during subsequent fiscal years.]

23 24	Each member of the House of Delegates may select the recipients of the scholarships on any basis that the Delegate considers appropriate.]

	(a) During each term in office, each Delegate may award the equivalent of four 4-year full-time scholarships, which may be awarded for either 1-, 2-, 3-, or 4-year periods.
29 30	(b) (1) Each scholarship pays the tuition and mandatory fees at any eligible institution.
	(2) The annual amount of a scholarship at a private institution or any graduate or professional program may not exceed the equivalent annual tuition and mandatory fees of an undergraduate program at the University of Maryland.]

35 36	(a) A Delegate may award 2 part-time scholarships for each full-time scholarship available.

1 2	(b) A part-time scholarship may not be for more than twice as many years as a full-time scholarship.
3	(c) Each recipient of a part-time scholarship shall carry at least 6 semester hours of courses each semester in a program leading to a degree.]

6 7	(a) Each recipient of a full-time Delegate Scholarship may use the scholarship to attend summer school.
8 9	(b) The term of a full-time Delegate Scholarship shall be shortened by one-half year for each summer of use.
10 11	(c) The amount used for summer school may not exceed one half of the value of the award for the next academic year.]

15 16 17	(a) As an alternative to the scholarship awards authorized by §§ 18-503 through 18-505 of this subtitle, and subject to the provisions of subsection (b) of this section, during each year in office each Delegate may award scholarships in a total amount equal to four times the tuition and mandatory fees for a full-time undergraduate student enrolled at the University of Maryland at College Park for the academic year commencing in that year.
19	(b) A scholarship award under subsection (a) of this section:
20 21	(1) May not be for an amount less than \$200 or more than one-half of the total amount of scholarships authorized by subsection (a) for that year;
22	(2) Shall be used at an eligible institution;
23	(3) May be used by:
24	(i) A graduate, undergraduate, or professional student; or
27	(ii) A student at a private career school within the State that is approved by the Maryland Higher Education Commission under § 11-202 of this article and that is accredited by a national accrediting association that is approved by the United States Department of Education; and
	(4) To the extent it is not used by the student, shall be recredited to the Delegate's scholarship account and may be awarded in the next 12 months by that Delegate to another student pursuant to this section. ]

35	(a) Beginning in Fiscal Year 1996, each Delegate may authorize the State Scholarship Administration to award all or a portion of the funds authorized under this subtitle to eligible recipients of an Educational Excellence Award who reside in the Delegate's legislative district.
37	(b) In the event that the total number of eligible recipients of an Educational

38 Excellence Award who reside in the Delegate's legislative district is insufficient to utilize

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- 1 the total amount of funds available to the Delegate for any fiscal year, the State
- 2 Scholarship Administration may, with the consent of the Delegate, award the unused
- 3 funds to other eligible recipients throughout the State.]
- 4 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, notwithstanding the
- 5 provisions of this Act, a recipient of a House of Delegates Scholarship Program award
- 6 that is made prior to October 1, 1997, shall continue to be eligible to receive the full
- $7\,$  amount of that scholarship award for the duration of the eligibility period applicable to
- 8 that recipient.
- 9 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That any unexpended
- 10 appropriation under the House of Delegates Scholarship Program after October 1, 1997
- 11 that is not needed to meet scholarship award commitments that are made to eligible
- 12 recipients in accordance with the provisions of this Act shall be transferred to and
- 13 awarded under the Educational Excellence Award Program under Title 18, Subtitle 3 of
- 14 the Education Article.
- 15 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That commencing with the
- 16 fiscal year that begins on July 1, 1998 and each fiscal year thereafter, the Governor shall
- 17 include an appropriation in the State budget for the Educational Excellence Award
- 18 Program in an amount equal to the Fiscal Year 1997 appropriation for the House of
- 19 Delegates Scholarship Program. These moneys may not be used to supplant moneys that
- 20 would be appropriated to the Educational Excellence Award Program under the normal
- 21 budgetary process.
- 22 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the State Scholarship
- 23 Administration shall ensure that the funds that would have been appropriated under the
- 24 House of Delegates Scholarship Program each fiscal year continue to be equally
- 25 distributed by legislative district and that the student populations currently served by the
- 26 House of Delegates Scholarship Program in each legislative district, including part-time
- 27 students and adults returning to school, continue to be served by the additional funds
- 28 appropriated under the Educational Excellence Award Program.
- 29 SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 30 October 1, 1997.
