## A BILL ENTITLED

### 1 AN ACT concerning

#### 2 Maryland Veterans' Homes Commission

3 FOR the purpose of changing the name of the Maryland Veterans' Home Commission to

- 4 be the "Maryland Veterans' Homes Commission"; and generally relating to the
- 5 Maryland Veterans' Homes Commission.

6 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

- 7 Article State Government
- 8 Section 9-917, 9-918, and 9-920 through 9-930
- 9 Annotated Code of Maryland
- 10 (1995 Replacement Volume and 1996 Supplement)

#### 11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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13 Article - State Government
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14 9-917.

15 In this Part III of this subtitle, ["Home"] "HOMES" means the [home] HOMES for 16 veterans that the Maryland Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission supervises.

17 9-918.

(a) The purposes of the Maryland Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission are tooperate and to manage in the State a home for veterans.

20 (b) The General Assembly declares the purposes of the Maryland Veterans'21 [Home] HOMES Commission to be of general benefit to the veterans of the State.

### 22 9-920.

23 There is a Maryland Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission.

24 9-921.

(a) The Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission consists of the following 15members:

(1) 11 individuals appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of28 the Senate; and

1 (2) as ex officio members:
2 (i) the Governor;
3 (ii) the President of the Senate;
4 (iii) the Speaker of the House of Delegates; and
<ul><li>5 (iv) the Chairman of the Maryland [Veterans] VETERANS' HOMES</li><li>6 Commission.</li></ul>
7 (b) (1) The term of an appointed member is 4 years.
8 (2) The terms of the appointed members are staggered as required by the 9 terms provided for members of the Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission on October 10 1, 1984.
<ul><li>(3) At the end of a term, a member continues to serve until a successor is</li><li>appointed and qualifies.</li></ul>
<ul><li>13 (4) A member who is appointed after a term has begun serves only for the</li><li>14 rest of the term and until a successor is appointed and qualifies.</li></ul>
<ul> <li>(c) As far as is practicable and is consistent with the purposes and goals of the</li> <li>Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission, the Governor shall choose appointed members</li> <li>so as to have a broad distribution from among:</li> </ul>
18 (1) veterans and veterans' groups; and
19 (2) the geographical areas of the State.

<ul> <li>(a) From among its members, the Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission shall</li> <li>elect a chairman, a secretary, and any other officers that the Commission considers</li> <li>appropriate.</li> </ul>
<ul><li>(b) The manner of election of officers and their terms of office shall be as the</li><li>Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission determines.</li></ul>

<ul><li>(a) Seven members of the Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission are a quorum</li><li>to do business.</li></ul>
29 (b) (1) The Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission shall meet:
30 (i) at least twice a year, at the times and places that it determines; and
<ul><li>(ii) at the call of the Chairman, on the Chairman's initiative or on the</li><li>request of at least 4 members.</li></ul>
33 (2) Unless all of the members of the Veterans' [Home] HOMES

34 Commission agree otherwise, the secretary of the Commission shall give each member at

35 least 7 days' written notice of a meeting.

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<ol> <li>(3) If the President is unable to attend a meeting, the President may</li> <li>designate a Senator or an employee of the General Assembly to represent the President</li> <li>at the meeting.</li> </ol>
<ul> <li>4 (4) If the Speaker is unable to attend a meeting, the Speaker may designate</li> <li>5 a delegate or an employee of the General Assembly to represent the Speaker at the</li> <li>6 meeting.</li> </ul>
<ul><li>7 (5) If the Governor is unable to attend a meeting, the Governor may</li><li>8 designate another individual to represent the Governor at the meeting.</li></ul>
9 (c) A member of the Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission:
10 (1) may not receive compensation, but
<ul><li>(2) is entitled to reimbursement for expenses under the Standard State</li><li>Travel Regulations, as provided in the State budget.</li></ul>

<ul><li>17 (a) (1) The Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission shall submit an annual</li><li>18 report:</li></ul>
19 (i) to the Governor; and
20 (ii) subject to § 2-1312 of this article, to the General Assembly.
21 (2) The annual report shall:
22 (i) describe the activities of the Commission; and
<ul><li>23 (ii) include any recommendations for furthering the purposes of the</li><li>24 Commission.</li></ul>
<ul> <li>(b) As far as practicable, the Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission shall</li> <li>cooperate with persons and public agencies to carry out the purposes and goals of the</li> <li>Commission.</li> </ul>
28 9-926.
29 (a) The Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission may adopt regulations to:
30 (1) govern itself; and
31 (2) carry out the purposes and goals of the Commission.
<ul> <li>32 (b) (1) The Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission may take any necessary</li> <li>33 and proper action to carry out a specific power under this Part III of this subtitle.</li> </ul>
34 (2) Subject to the legislative purposes of this Part III of this subtitle, the

<sup>35</sup> Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission may make contracts and other legal agreements.

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2 powers to a committee of 1 or more of its members or to the Commandant of the
3 [Home] HOMES.
4 (2) If the Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission delegates any power to a
5 committee of its members, the committee:
6 (i) may not incur any expenses without the consent of the
7 Commission; and
8 (ii) at each regular meeting of the Commission or more often as it
9 directs, shall submit to the Commission a report on any action that the committee has

(c) (1) The Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission may delegate any of its

10 taken since its last report.

12 (a) The Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission shall:

(1) maintain and supervise generally the [Home] HOMES in accordancewith this Part III of this subtitle; and

(2) adopt any regulation that is needed for management of the [Home]HOMES, including regulations for admission, maintenance, and discharge of [its] THEresidents.

(b) (1) The Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission may appoint a
Commandant for the [Home] HOMES and employ any other staff that is needed to
manage the [Home] HOMES properly.

(2) In appointing or employing staff, the Veterans' [Home] HOMES
Commission shall give preference to a veteran who has an honorable discharge from the
armed forces.

24 (3) The Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission shall set the salary for each
25 official of the [Home] HOMES in an amount that does not exceed the salary paid by
26 similar institutions for the service.

27 (4) The Commandant shall:
28 (i) serve at the pleasure of the Veterans' [Home] HOMES

30 (ii) perform any duty that the Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission

<ul><li>(a) To carry out the purposes and goals of the Veterans' [Home] HOMES</li><li>Commission, the Commission may acquire, hold, use, improve, and convey property.</li></ul>	
<ul><li>(b) In addition to any other power under this section, to carry out the purposes or</li><li>goals of the Veterans' [Home] HOMES Commission, the Commission:</li></ul>	
16 (1) may accept a gift or grant; and	
<ul><li>17 (2) unless the terms of a gift or grant require otherwise, on an affirmative</li><li>18 vote of at least 7 members of the Commission, may:</li></ul>	
19 (i) spend the principal and income of the gift or grant; or	
20 (ii) invest all or part of the principal and income in:	
211. general obligations of the State; or	
22 2. any other security.	
<ul> <li>(c) (1) In addition to any other power under this section, the Veterans'</li> <li>[Home] HOMES Commission may lease any part of its property for use as a concession or</li> <li>other commercial purpose that is consistent with the purposes of the Commission.</li> <li>However, the Commission may not lease its property merely for investment purposes.</li> </ul>	
<ul><li>(2) Notwithstanding any other law, unless the lease expressly provides for</li><li>redemption by the tenant, the lease is not subject to redemption.</li></ul>

The State is not obligated to provide capital or operating funds for the Veterans' Home] HOMES Commission but may appropriate money for the purposes and goals of the Commission.
