- 4 FOR the purpose of altering the number of hours of laboratory instruction in a driver
- 5 education course that an individual under a certain age must complete before the
- 6 individual qualifies for a driver's license; requiring a certain number of hours of
- 7 nighttime driving laboratory instructio nunder certain circumstances; requiring the
- 8 curriculum in the classroom phase of all driver education courses to be standardized
- 9 and based on a certain curriculum; making stylistic changes; and generally relating
- 10 to requirements regarding the number of hours of laboratory instruction and a
- standardized curriculum in driver education programs.

#### 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
