- 13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15 Article - Courts and Judicial Proceedings

- 17 IN AN ACTION TO INVALIDATE A CONFIRMATORY DEED, INCLUDING
- 18 OBTAINING OTHER RELIEF DIRECTLY RELATED TO INVALIDATION OF THE DEED, IF
- 19 THE COURT FINDS IN FAVOR OF THE PLAINTIFF, THE PLAINTIFF SHALL BE ENTITLED
- 20 TO RECOVER THE COSTS AND EXPENSES OF LITIGATION, INCLUDING REASONABLE
- 21 ATTORNEY'S FEES, IF THE CONFIRMATORY DEED:
- 22 (1) WAS RECORDED FOR THE PURPOSE OF CLARIFYING THE LOCATION
- 23 OR EXISTENCE OF AN EASEMENT FOR INGRESS OR EGRESS;
- 24 (2) ERRONEOUSLY DESCRIBED AN EASEMENT FOR INGRESS OR EGRESS
- 25 ON LAND IN WHICH THE PLAINTIFF HAS A PROPERTY INTEREST; AND
- 26 (3) WAS RECORDED WITHOUT THE PLAINTIFF'S CONSENT.
- 27 SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall apply to any
- 28 confirmatory deed that has been recorded on or before the effective date of this Act and
- 29 to any confirmatory deed filed after the effective date of this Act.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect

2 October 1, 1997.
