	WHEREAS, It is the intent of the General Assembly to transfer funds appropriated to the Senatorial Scholarship Program and the House of Delegates Scholarship Program to the HOPE Scholarship Program; now, therefore,
4 5	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

7	[Subtitle 4. Senatorial Scholarships.]

9 10	There is a program of senatorial scholarships in this State that are awarded under this subtitle.]

12 13	(a) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) of this subsection, each applicant for a senatorial scholarship shall:
14 15	(i) Take a competitive examination administered by the Administration; and
	(ii) Be accepted for admission in the regular undergraduate, graduate, or professional program at an eligible institution; or be enrolled in a 2-year terminal certificate program in which the course work is acceptable for transfer credit for an
	accredited baccalaureate program in an eligible institution.
20	(2) An applicant is exempt from the examination if the applicant:
21 22	(i) Is attending an eligible institution and has completed at least 1 year in good academic standing at the institution;
23 24	(ii) Graduated from high school at least 5 years before application for a senatorial scholarship;
27	(iii) Is accepted for admission to a private career institution, if the institution's curriculum is approved by the Commission, and the institution is accredited by a national accrediting association approved by the United States Department of Education; or

The Task Force shall make recommendations on:

14	(2) Eligibility criteria used to award State scholarships; and
15	(3) Other matters that the Task Force considers significant.
16	(c) The Task Force shall be composed of 14 members as follows:
17 18	(1) Three members of the House of Delegates of Maryland, appointed by the Speaker of the House;
19 20	(2) Three members of the Senate of Maryland, appointed by the President of the Senate;
21 22	(3) Two representatives of the Maryland Higher Education Commission, to be appointed by the Governor:
23 24	(4) A representative of the Governor's Executive Staff, to be appointed by the Governor;
25 26	(5) A representative of the Board of Regents of the University of Maryland System, to be appointed by the Governor;
27 28	(6) A representative of the Maryland Independent Colleges and Universities Association, to be appointed by the Governor; and
29 30	(7) Three members of the public who have significant experience in areas relevant to the Task Force, to be appointed by the Governor.
31 32	(d) The Speaker of the House and President of the Senate shall designate Cochairmen of the Task Force;
33 34	(e) The Maryland Higher Education Commission shall provide staff for the Task Force.
35	(f) A member of the Task Force may not receive compensation for serving on the
