1 AN ACT concerning

2 **PenMar Development Corporation**

- FOR the purpose of creating the PenMar Development Corporation as a public 3
- 4 instrumentality of the State; providing for the establishment, membership, and
- 5 officers of the Board of Directors of the Corporation; providing for the
- appointment, powers, and duties of the executive director of the Corporation; 6
- 7 providing for the powers of the Corporation; authorizing the Corporation to issue
- 8 revenue bonds; authorizing the Corporation to fix and revise rates or charges for
- 9 certain services; providing for certain rights of holders of bonds issued under this
- 10 Act; providing that bonds issued by the Corporation are securities in which certain
- 11 public officers, political subdivisions, and others may invest; providing for certain
- 12 exemptions from certain taxes or assessments except under certain circumstances;
- providing for the creation, continuation, and administration of the funds of the 13
- 14 Corporation; requiring a certain report; providing certain exemptions for the
- 15 Corporation from certain provisions of State law; declaring the intent of the
- General Assembly; providing for the construction of this Act; defining certain 16
- terms; making this Act an emergency measure; and generally relating to the creation 17

- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 25

- 7 INCLUDING BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES, REVENUE ANTICIPATION NOTES, GRANT
- 8 ANTICIPATION NOTES, REFUNDING BONDS, NOTES IN THE NATURE OF COMMERCIAL
- 9 PAPER, OR OTHER EVIDENCES OF INDEBTEDNESS OF THE CORPORATION, WHETHER
- 10 GENERAL OR LIMITED OBLIGATIONS OF THE CORPORATION ISSUED UNDER THIS

- 12 (C) "CORPORATION" MEANS THE PENMAR DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION.
- 13 (D) "COST" SHALL INCLUDE THE PURCHASE PRICE OF ANY PROJECT OR THE
- 14 COST OF ACQUIRING ALL OR ANY PORTION OF THE RIGHT, TITLE, OR INTEREST OF
- 15 A PROJECT AND THE AMOUNT TO BE PAID TO DISCHARGE ALL OBLIGATIONS
- 16 NECESSARY OR DESIRABLE TO VEST TITLE TO THE PROJECT OR ANY PART OF IT IN
- 17 THE CORPORATION OR OTHER OWNER; THE COST OF ANY RECONSTRUCTION,
- 18 EXTENSION, ENLARGEMENT, ALTERATION, REPAIR, OR IMPROVEMENT; THE COST
- 19 OF ALL LANDS, PROPERTIES, RIGHTS, EASEMENTS, FRANCHISES, AND PERMITS; THE
- 20 COST OF ALL LABOR, MACHINERY, AND EQUIPMENT; FINANCING CHARGES;
- 21 INTEREST BEFORE AND DURING CONSTRUCTION AND, IF DEEMED DESIRABLE BY
- 22 THE CORPORATION, FOR A LIMITED PERIOD AFTER THE COMPLETION OF
- 23 CONSTRUCTION; RESERVES FOR PRINCIPAL AND INTEREST AND FOR EXTENSIONS,
- 24 ENLARGEMENTS, ADDITIONS, AND IMPROVEMENTS; THE COST OF REVENUE
- 25 ESTIMATES, ENGINEERING, AND LEGAL SERVICES, PLANS, DESIGNS,
- 26 SPECIFICATIONS, SURVEYS, INVESTIGATIONS, DEMONSTRATIONS, STUDIES,
- 27 ESTIMATES OF COST, OTHER EXPENSES NECESSARY OR INCIDENT TO DETERMINING
- 28 THE FEASIBILITY OR PRACTICABILITY OF ANY SUCH ACQUISITION, IMPROVEMENT,
- 29 REPAIR, OR CONSTRUCTION; ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES, AND OTHER EXPENSES
- 30 AS NECESSARY OR INCIDENT TO PROJECT FINANCINGS, AND TO THE ACQUISITION,
- 31 OPERATION, MAINTENANCE, IMPROVEMENT, CONSTRUCTION, AND MARKETING OF
- 32 A PROJECT AND THE PLACING OF THE SAME IN OPERATION BY THE CORPORATION
- 33 OR OTHER OWNER, INCLUDING REASONABLE PROVISION FOR WORKING CAPITAL.
- 34 (E) "INCLUDES OR INCLUDING" MEANS INCLUDES OR INCLUDING BY WAY OF
- 35 ILLUSTRATION AND NOT BY WAY OF LIMITATION.
- 36 (F) "PERSON" MEANS ANY NATURAL PERSON, CORPORATION, FIRM,
- 37 PARTNERSHIP, COOPERATIVE, POLITICAL SUBDIVISION, OR OTHER ENTITY.
- 38 (G) "POLITICAL SUBDIVISION" MEANS ANY COUNTY, MUNICIPAL
- 39 CORPORATION, STATE OR LOCAL AGENCY, OR OTHER PUBLIC BODY OR AGENCY
- 40 CREATED OR ESTABLISHED UNDER STATE OR LOCAL LAW.

- 1 (H) (1) "PROJECT" MEANS THE ESTABLISHMENT OF ECONOMIC ACTIVITY
- 2 ON THE PROPERTY THAT IS CURRENTLY FORT RITCHIE, MARYLAND, TO BE
- 3 CONVEYED TO THE CORPORATION BY THE U.S. ARMY AND INCLUDES THOSE
- 4 FACILITIES AND PROPERTIES USED OR USEFUL IN CONNECTION WITH
- 5 MANUFACTURING, RETAIL, TRADE, SERVICE INDUSTRIES, SUPPLY, WHOLESALING,
- 6 WAREHOUSING, OR ANY OTHER INDUSTRIAL, COMMERCIAL, OR BUSINESS
- 7 PURPOSES, INCLUDING ANY COMBINATION OF THESE ACTIVITIES, WHETHER FOR

- 16 OTHER RIGHTS NECESSARY OR USEFUL IN THE CONSTRUCTION OR OPERATION OF

- 18 (II) ANY FACILITIES AND PROPERTIES WITHIN THE DEFINITION OF
- 19 "PROJECT" SET FORTH IN THIS SUBSECTION, WHETHER OR NOT THESE FACILITIES
- 20 OR PROPERTIES CAN BE FINANCED BY BONDS THE INTEREST ON WHICH IS TAX
- 21 EXEMPT UNDER THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE.
- 22 (I) "REVENUES" INCLUDES ALL INCOME, REVENUES, AND OTHER MONEYS
- 23 RECEIVED BY THE CORPORATION FROM OR IN CONNECTION WITH ANY PROJECT,
- 24 INCLUDING GRANTS, RENTALS, RATES, FEES, CHARGES FOR THE USE OF THE
- 25 SERVICES FURNISHED OR AVAILABLE, AND ALL OTHER INCOME INURING TO THE
- 26 CORPORATION.
- 27 5-1202.
- 28 (A) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY DECLARES AND FINDS THAT THE ECONOMY OF
- 29 WASHINGTON COUNTY WILL BE GREATLY IMPACTED BY THE CLOSURE OF FORT
- 30 RITCHIE. THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY RECOGNIZES THAT, WHILE THIS CLOSURE WILL
- 31 RESULT IN ECONOMIC CONTRACTION AND DISLOCATION, IT ALSO AFFORDS
- 32 OPPORTUNITIES TO EXPAND PRODUCTIVE EMPLOYMENT AND EXPAND THE STATE'S
- 33 ECONOMY AND TAX BASE.
- 34 (B) THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FURTHER DECLARES AND FINDS THAT THE
- 35 ESTABLISHMENT OF A STATE PUBLIC CORPORATION TO DEVELOP FORT RITCHIE
- 36 WOULD SERVE THE PUBLIC INTEREST. IT WOULD COMPLEMENT EXISTING STATE
- 37 MARKETING PROGRAMS ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS AND
- 38 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT THROUGH ITS OFFICE OF BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT AND
- 39 RESOURCES AND THROUGH FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS SUCH AS THOSE OF
- 40 THE MARYLAND INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT FINANCING AUTHORITY, THE
- 41 MARYLAND INDUSTRIAL LAND ACT, AND THE MARYLAND INDUSTRIAL AND

- 2 ASSEMBLY ALSO INTENDS THAT THE CORPORATION STRUCTURE ITS PROJECTS IN A
- 3 MANNER WHICH ACCELERATES THE TRANSFER OF FACILITIES AND SITES INTO
- 4 PRODUCTIVE USE IN THE PRIVATE SECTOR AND COOPERATE WITH LOCAL
- 5 GOVERNMENTS IN MAXIMIZING NEW ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITIES FOR THE
- 6 CITIZENS OF THIS STATE.

- 8 (A) (1) THE CORPORATION IS A BODY POLITIC AND CORPORATE AND IS
- 9 CONSTITUTED AS A PUBLIC INSTRUMENTALITY OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND.
- 10 (2) THE EXERCISE BY THE CORPORATION OF THE POWERS CONFERRED
- 11 BY THIS SUBTITLE SHALL BE DEEMED TO BE THE PERFORMANCE OF AN ESSENTIAL
- 12 PUBLIC FUNCTION.
- 13 (B) (1) A BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL MANAGE THE AFFAIRS OF THE
- 14 CORPORATION AND SHALL EXERCISE ALL OF ITS CORPORATE POWERS.
- 15 (2) (I) THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL CONSIST OF 15 MEMBERS
- 16 APPOINTED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF WASHINGTON COUNTY.
- 17 (II) THE SECRETARY OF BUSINESS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT,
- 18 THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE MARYLAND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT
- 19 CORPORATION, AND THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE WASHINGTON COUNTY
- 20 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION SHALL BE EX OFFICIO MEMBERS.
- 21 (3) (I) THE TERM OF AN APPOINTED MEMBER OF THE BOARD IS 4
- 22 YEARS.
- 23 (II) EACH MEMBER SHALL TAKE AN OATH TO ADMINISTER THE
- 24 DUTIES OF THE OFFICE FAITHFULLY AND IMPARTIALLY.
- 25 (III) THE TERMS OF APPOINTED MEMBERS SHALL BE
- 26 STAGGERED TO ENSURE LONG-TERM CONTINUITY IN BOARD ACTION.
- 27 (IV) (III) AT THE END OF A TERM, A MEMBER CONTINUES TO
- 28 SERVE UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS APPOINTED.
- 29 (V) (IV) A MEMBER WHO IS APPOINTED AFTER A TERM HAS
- 30 BEGUN SERVES ONLY FOR THE REST OF THE TERM AND UNTIL A SUCCESSOR IS
- 31 APPOINTED.
- 32 (C) (1) THE BOARD SHALL ELECT ONE OF ITS MEMBERS AS CHAIRMAN, ONE
- 33 AS VICE CHAIRMAN, AND ONE AS TREASURER.
- 34 (2) EIGHT MEMBERS OF THE BOARD CONSTITUTE A QUORUM, BUT
- 35 ACTION MAY NOT BE TAKEN BY LESS THAN THE VOTE OF EIGHT MEMBERS.

- 10 ACCORDANCE WITH POLICIES AND PROCEDURES ESTABLISHED BY THE BOARD OF

- 12 (2) THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR, OR THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S
- 13 DESIGNEE, SHALL, AMONG OTHER THINGS:
- 14 (I) ATTEND ALL MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS AND
- 15 ACT AS SECRETARY TO THE BOARD AND KEEP MINUTES OF ALL ITS PROCEEDINGS;
- 16 (II) APPROVE ALL ACCOUNTS FOR SALARIES, PER DIEM
- 17 PAYMENTS, AND ALLOWABLE EXPENSES OF THE CORPORATION OR OF ANY OF ITS
- 18 EMPLOYEES OR CONSULTANTS AS WELL AS ANY EXPENSES INCIDENTAL TO THE
- 19 OPERATION OF THE CORPORATION; AND
- 20 (III) PERFORM ANY OTHER DUTIES THAT MAY BE DIRECTED BY
- 21 THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS IN CARRYING OUT THE PURPOSES OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- 22 (C) (1) THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS SHALL APPROVE ANY ADDITIONAL
- 23 PROFESSIONAL AND CLERICAL STAFF THAT IS NECESSARY TO CARRY OUT THE
- 24 PURPOSES OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- 25 (2) THE OFFICERS OR EMPLOYEES OF THE CORPORATION ARE NOT
- 26 SUBJECT TO:

- 29 (II) THE PROVISIONS OF DIVISION I OF THE STATE PERSONNEL

- 2 FEES, AND CHARGES FOR THE USE OF OR FOR SERVICES AND FACILITIES PROVIDED
- 3 OR MADE AVAILABLE BY THE CORPORATION;
- 4 (14) ENTER WITH THE PERMISSION OF THE OWNER UPON LANDS,
- 5 WATERS, OR PREMISES FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAKING SURVEYS, SOUNDINGS,
- 6 BORINGS, AND EXAMINATIONS TO ACCOMPLISH ANY PURPOSE AUTHORIZED BY

- 8 (15) EXERCISE ANY POWER USUALLY POSSESSED BY PRIVATE
