## 1 AN ACT concerning

### 2 Education - Maryland Adult External High School Program - Funding

- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the State Department of Education to maintain the
- 4 funding of the Maryland Adult External High School Program at a certain level for
- 5 a certain time period; clarifying the establishment and requirements of, as well as
- 6 the recognition of the need for, the Maryland Adult External High School Program;
- 7 requiring the State Board of Education to evaluate the Program and submit a
- 8 certain report to the General Assembly before a certain date; and generally relating
- 9 to adult education in the State.
- 10 BY repealing and reenacting, without amendments,

- 20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 22 Article Education
- 23 1-101.
- 24 (f) "Department" means the State Department of Education.
- 25 (1) "State Board" means the State Board of Education.
- 26 7-205.1.
- 27 (A) THERE IS A MARYLAND ADULT EXTERNAL HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAM
- 28 ESTABLISHED FOR THE CITIZENS OF MARYLAND UNDER REGULATIONS ADOPTED
- 29 BY THE STATE BOARD.

### 1 (B) ACCORDING TO THESE REGULATIONS:

- 2 (1) THE STATE BOARD RECOGNIZES DEMONSTRATED COMPETENCIES
- 3 IN ADULTS, REGARDLESS OF WHETHER THESE COMPETENCIES WERE ACQUIRED IN
- 4 A FORMAL SCHOOL SETTING; AND
- 5 (2) IN RESPONSE TO THIS RECOGNITION OF COMPETENCIES, THE
- 6 DEPARTMENT PROVIDES ALTERNATIVE REQUIREMENTS AND METHODS OF
- 7 OBTAINING A MARYLAND HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA.
- 8 (C) BECAUSE THE PROGRAM IS A VALUABLE SERVICE THAT IS PROVIDED TO
- 9 THE CITIZENS OF MARYLAND, AT LEAST THROUGH FISCAL YEAR 2003, FUNDING FOR
- 10 THE PROGRAM IN THE BUDGET OF THE DEPARTMENT SHALL BE AT A MINIMUM
- 11 EQUAL TO THE FUNDING FOR THE PROGRAM IN THE FISCAL YEAR 1997 BUDGET.
- 12 (D) DURING FISCAL YEAR 2003, IN ORDER TO ASSESS THE EFFECTIVENESS OF
- 13 THE PROGRAM, THE STATE BOARD SHALL CONDUCT AN EVALUATION OF THE
- 14 PROGRAM.
- 15 (E) THE STATE BOARD SHALL REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ON OR
- 16 BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 2003, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1312 OF THE STATE
- 17 GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON THE RESULTS OF THE EVALUATION OF THE PROGRAM.
- 18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 19 July 1, 1997.
