A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **State Board of Physician Quality Assurance - Discipline of Physicians - System of**
3 **Delivery of Health Care Services**

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the State Board of Physician Quality Assurance to
5 discipline physicians who have certain responsibilities relating to a system of
6 delivery of health care services and the system fails to meet certain standards; and
7 generally relating to the authority of the State Board of Physician Quality Assurance
8 to discipline physicians who are responsible for establishing or supervising protocol
9 or procedures for a system of delivery of health care services.

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

22 **Article - Health Occupations**

23 14-404.

24 (a) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 14-405 of this subtitle, the Board, on the
25 affirmative vote of a majority of its full authorized membership, may reprimand any
26 licensee, place any licensee on probation, or suspend or revoke a license if the licensee:

27 (35) Is in breach of a service obligation resulting from the applicant's or
28 licensee's receipt of State or federal funding for the licensee's medical education; [or]

29 (36) Willfully makes a false representation when seeking or making
30 application for licensure or any other application related to the practice of medicine; OR

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1 (37) (I) IS A PHYSICIAN WHO IS RESPONSIBLE FOR ESTABLISHING OR
2 SUPERVISING PROTOCOL OR PROCEDURES FOR A SYSTEM OF DELIVERY OF HEALTH
3 CARE SERVICES AND THE SYSTEM FAILS TO MEET APPROPRIATE STANDARDS FOR
4 THE DELIVERY OF QUALITY MEDICAL CARE AS DETERMINED BY APPROPRIATE
5 PEER REVIEW

6 (II) UNDER THIS SUBSECTION, A PHYSICIAN MAY NOT BE
7 DISCIPLINED BY THE BOARD FOR THE INDEPENDENT JUDGMENT ERROR OF A
8 HEALTH CARE PROVIDER WHO IS PROVIDING DIRECT PATIENT CARE IN
9 CONTRADICTION TO ESTABLISHED PROTOCOL OR PROCEDURES FOR A SYSTEM OF
10 DELIVERY OF QUALITY MEDICAL CARE.

11 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
12 October 1, 1997.
