- 8 commended, or honored by this body since its inception; and
- 9 WHEREAS, We are the State and nation of immigrants; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The State government would be remiss if it were not to recognize
- 11 Maryland immigrants, to protect their interests, and to nurture the role they play in
- 12 community life; and
- WHEREAS, Maryland immigrants are hard-working, industrious, steadfast,
- 14 diligent, loyal and productive participants and leaders in all aspects of State life and
- 15 government; and
- WHEREAS, Maryland immigrants have an exceptional range of skills, talents,
- 17 trades, and credentials; and
- WHEREAS, Maryland immigrants often work in unsatisfactory conditions and at all
- 19 hours of the day and night all year long; and
- WHEREAS, Maryland immigrants lack many of the perquisites, benefits, and
- 21 advantages of the mainstream Americans; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Maryland immigrants often perform extraordinarily dangerous work
- 23 under hazardous conditions without recognition or commendation; and
- WHEREAS, Maryland immigrants who are naturalized have the same rights of full
- 25 citizenship as the U.S. citizens regardless of their country of origin or the color of their
- 26 skin; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Maryland immigrants strengthen and enrich the fabric of a culturally
- 28 diverse society; now, therefore, be it
- 29 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the
- 30 General Assembly recognizes the dedication, talents, loyalty, hard work, and priceless
